POPE FRANCIS TO VOLUNTEERS: Last Sunday in his homily for the canonization Mass of Mother Teresa, Pope Francis included a few sentences about volunteers. To thank the parishioners who volunteer at St. Anthony, at St. Rita's, at the Lord's Pantry, at Hilty Home and wherever else, I can do no better than to direct the Pope's words to you:


"Following Jesus is a serious task, and, at the same time, one filled with joy; it takes a certain daring and courage to recognize the divine Master in the poorest of the poor and those who are cast aside, and to give oneself in their service. In order to do so, volunteers, who out of love of Jesus serve the poor and the needy, do not expect any thanks or recompense; rather they renounce all this because they have discovered true love. And each one of us can say: 'Just as the Lord has come to meet me and has stooped down to my level in my hour of need, so too do I go to meet him, bending low before those who have lost faith or who live as though God did not exist, before young people without values or ideals, before families in crisis, before the ill and the imprisoned, before refugees and immigrants, before the weak and defenseless in body and spirit, before abandoned children, before the elderly who are on their own. Wherever someone is reaching out, asking for a helping hand in order to get up, this is where our presence – and the presence of the Church which sustains and offers hope – must be'. And I do this, keeping alive the memory of those times when the Lord's hand reached out to me when I was in need."

A SAD ANNIVERSARY: December 7, 1941. November 22, 1963. September 11, 2001. Each generation has its unforgettable day. My mother remembered that she was helping fold bed sheets at St. Vincent Hospital when she got the news about Pearl Harbor. (She and Dad had gotten engaged not long before; the wedding was postponed until 1946.) I was in German class at St. Francis in my junior year when word came over the PA that President Kennedy was dead. I was late getting the news about 9/11. None of us at St. Charles in Toledo had the radio or TV on for the morning news; it was almost 11 a.m. when the cook called about next week's schedule and said, "Isn't it terrible what happened in New York?"

With Pearl Harbor and JFK's assassination, much of the hurt had gone away after 15 years. Fifteen years after 9/11, acts of terrorism seem to occur somewhere almost monthly to remind us afresh. How do we fight this form of disrespect for human life? How do we overcome the hatred that seems to have taken over a significant part of our globe? We bear witness to God's love, but our witness is rejected because they say we're unbelievers. Armed might doesn't seem to be an answer. We can finish off ISIS, but when we do, another terrorist group will spring up. We spend a fortune on security, but our security personnel have to be right 100% of the time, while the terrorists only have to be right once. Is there an answer?

There seems to be no answer except the answer of Jesus in today's Gospel: "There will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance." Yes, our military has to protect us; our courts have to punish the guilty; but neither of them has the final answer. Only if we pray for, and work for the reconciliation that Jesus called for will there be an answer. Or as Mother Teresa once said: The fruit of silence is prayer. The fruit of prayer is faith. The fruit of faith is love. The fruit of love is service. The fruit of service is Peace."

The Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima will be at Saint Anthony on Wednesday, October 19. The plan is to have Rosary devotions every hour on the hour, beginning after Mass and concluding at 7 p.m. I am going to ask our parish and school organizations to help with these devotions.


