

## A Note from Fr. Tom

**PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT:** I would like to make a few reflections on the parish financial report that was in last week's bulletin, and on the relationship between the parish and the school. The report shows that the parish gave \$414,273 to the school in the 2015-16 school year. \$293,708 of this was in the form of parish envelope donations that people had designated for the school; the remaining \$120,565 was a direct subsidy from the parish that came from the festival, other fundraisers (like purse bingo), and everyone's Sunday donations. Total school expenses (operating and major improvement expense) were \$677,049. So the parish paid 61.2% of the school's expenses.

Or to look at it another way, total parish income (including amounts designated for the school) was \$632,919. 65.4% of the parish's total income went to the school. That left 34.6% to pay for everything else: CCD, worship, the parish office, and parish utilities, insurance, salaries and benefits, etc. Benefits consist mainly of the employer's portion of Social Security and health care coverage.


For the present school year, we gave the faculty raises totaling \$24,379. This is more than the income we will derive from this year's raise in tuitions. Yet it is well deserved. We are coming closer to the 80% of public-school salaries that the Diocese recommends, but we aren't there yet. The faculty deserves more, but given the current state of our finances, I don't think we could have done much more.

The parish paid \$3106 for permanent improvements. The amount was low because we postponed some maintenance (like tuck-pointing the church exterior and painting the interior). Another reason for this low figure was the amount of donated labor and materials. The new exit drive for the cemetery was mostly donated. So was the leveling and draining of the Palte property. Our most expensive permanent improvement was the re-finishing of the cemetery crucifix and the repairs to its base. This repair couldn't have been postponed any longer without risking major damage from the weather.

Now I don't begrudge the school a penny. I don't feel qualified to comment on the students' academic achievements; I will leave that for Mr. Hummel to do in a future bulletin. What I can comment on is their wholehearted participation in Mass, and last year's survey forms in which our kids said that Mass and faith formation are among the things they appreciate most. That, as the commercial says, is priceless.

For the first time in quite a few years, the parish operated at a deficit in 2015-16. In February, I asked everyone to increase donations by \$2-\$10 per Sunday if possible. I think we can cure our deficit if everyone is faithful to the commitment they made at that time. Thanks to everyone – adult parishioners, young parishioners and teachers – for everything that you have done and are doing for our parish and school.

**BULLETIN INSERT:** We received a flyer from Priests for Life directly quoting the platforms of the two parties on various topics. We duplicated it because we felt it was informative. It contains nothing about any proposed farm policy, and it does not compare is the personalities of the two candidates, and how they might deal with the stresses and demands of being President. Each voter will have to weigh this factor prayerfully.
