END OF MY TERM: In the Diocese of Toledo, pastors are appointed for a six-year term that usually can be renewed only once. In the sixth year, there is an evaluation process to determine what is best for the parish and the priest: a second term, a new assignment, or retirement. I am now in my sixth year. I started the process by filling out a self-evaluation form. In addition, I had to name fifteen people with whom I have worked closely; they will be receiving a similar questionnaire in the mail. Fifty other parishioners, whom the Diocese will select at random from our mailing list, will likewise receive questionnaires. The data will be compiled and then evaluated by the Priests' Personnel Board (a team of five priests from different age groups, whom the priests elect.) They will make a recommendation to the Bishop, and he will make a final decision. If you receive a questionnaire, I would ask you to express your feelings and experiences honestly.

THE PAIN OF DIVORCE: When people go through a divorce, they often feel isolated and misunderstood. They even feel unwelcome at church because they feel that they have failed their family, the parish, and even God. Now our Church upholds the sanctity of marriage, but at the same time we want to accompany people whose marriage is in trouble, or whose marriage is coming to an end. We want divorced people to continue to be part of Saint Anthony. You need the Church, and the Church continues to need you.

During this Year of Mercy we especially want to help people who feel like they are being judged by the Church. Please know that divorce does not mean you can no longer receive the sacraments; divorce and remarriage is another matter.


If someone is divorced and remarried, the Church is willing to examine their marriage and see if the couple did not bring some essential quality to the marriage that is required for it to be a sacrament. For example, you can't have the Sacrament of Matrimony without a firm decision to live faithfully any more than you can have the Sacrament of the Eucharist without bread. Other examples would be a marriage in which someone cannot give themselves wholeheartedly to their spouse because they are addicted, or because it is ingrained in them that you can solve inter-personal problems with violence.

Sometimes a marriage is not valid because it was celebrated without following an essential rule of the Church. For example, if a Catholic got married outside the Church without proper permissions, that marriage would not be valid. (When two non-Catholics marry, the Church's presumption is that they married validly, because non-Catholics aren't bound to follow the laws of the Church.)

How much does an annulment cost? Bishop Blair lowered the charge to <u>zero</u>; mindful of the Year of Mercy, Bishop Thomas has continued this practice. The petitioner would get a notice of how much it costs the Diocese to process their petition, but no bill is sent. If someone makes an offering, that does <u>not</u> speed up their case; if they don't make an offering, their petition does <u>not</u> move to the bottom of the pile.

How long does it take to get an annulment? The average in the Diocese of Toledo is three to six months, provided that the witnesses return their questionnaires promptly. Pope Francis has eliminated the automatic appeal to a higher court of every diocesan decision to grant an annulment; this makes the process speedier and more user-friendly.
