# A Note from Fr. Tom

**ALL SAINTS – ALL SOULS:** On the survey we took up last spring, some people requested an earlier evening Mass for holy days of obligation. And yet some people need a later Mass because of the hours that they work. To accommodate as many people as possible, we will try this schedule for All Saints (October 31 – November 1) and for the feast of the Immaculate Conception:

- On the eve of the holy day, Mass will be at 4:30 p.m.
- On the holy day itself, Masses will be at 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

In January we will evaluate this schedule and decide whether or not to make it permanent.

Since All Souls is not a holy day of obligation, we will have only one Mass that day (Wednesday, November 2). That will be at 8:00 a.m. Our All Souls devotion will be on Sunday, November 6 at 2:00 p.m.


**SPECIAL COLLECTIONS:** Today we have put out envelopes for the Diocese of Toledo <u>pension fund for retired priests</u>. The pension plan for teachers and other lay employees is fully funded; the plan for retired priests is not, probably because the ratio of retired priests to active priests is becoming more unfavorable. The monthly pension check is especially crucial for the priests who are no longer physically able to earn money by helping in parishes.

The Bishops of the United States have asked for a special collection on October 29-30 for victims of Hurricane Matthew. The storm made 150,000 people homeless at least for a time. Damages from North Carolina to central Florida are in the billions. Catholic Charities of all US dioceses are sending aid to dioceses affected by this storm. Checks should be made out to Toledo Catholic Charities; we will write out one check from the parish to transmit the cash that people give.

I realize that we have had a lot of special collections lately, and one more is on the way: our traditional <u>Thanksgiving collection for the Lord's Pantry</u>. If these requests are too much of a strain on you, kindly don't feel obligated to give to each one of them. Please know that the Lord understands that you have done your best.

Bishop Thomas, Monsignor Singler, Sister Nancy and the 21 young men who are considering priesthood were all very impressed with the hospitality our parish showed.
