ALL SAINTS/ ALL SOULS: Some saints are famous, and are well beloved in the Catholic community. There are even saints whom we have seen in person. I can say that I've seen both St. John Paul II and St. Mother Theresa. I didn't meet them, but at least I saw them fairly up close. St. Isidore the Farmer and his wife St. Maria were not outstanding leaders like St. John Paul, but they became saints by raising children, working hard every day, and sharing what little they had with folks who were even poorer than they. My dictionary of saints lists hundreds of martyrs who were put to death by Henry VIII or Elizabeth I – for example, people like St. Margaret Clitherow, who was put to death because she sent her son to a Catholic school in France. When her house was searched, they found vessels for Mass, a Latin missal, and a hiding place for a priest behind a secret door. She was suffocated by having 800 pounds of stones piled on her. Pope Francis just canonized a 14-year-old named José Sánchez del Rio, an altar boy who fought in the revolution against the anti-Catholic government of Mexico in the 1920s. He was taken to a cemetery, shown an open grave, and was ordered to shout "Death to Christ the King." Instead he shouted "Viva Cristo Rey" ("Long live Christ the King") was shot on the spot and thrown in the grave. If I could get a picture of him, I would hang it in the altar servers' sacristy.

Why does the Church honor, indeed treasure all these people, some of them very ordinary? First, they inspire ordinary people to seek how to serve God today. Second, they are our fellow members of the Communion of Saints; they can, and do pray that we might know God better and serve Him more faithfully in our daily lives. We honor all of them, known and unknown on All Saints Day. We will have Mass on Monday at 4:30 p.m., and on All Saints Day itself at 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.

On All Souls Day, November 2, we honor another group of people in the Communion of Saints: all those people who will enter heaven one day, but are not yet ready for the vision of God because of habits of sin that still cling to them. Somehow our prayer helps them to deal with past habits of sin, and to be purified for heaven. It's not a holy day of obligation, so we will have only one Mass at 8:00 a.m.

CATHOLIC TEACHING ON CREMATION: You may have read that the Church has issued a document on cremation. Most of it simply repeats what was taught in a 1962 document, namely that people may have legitimate reasons for cremating a deceased family member (for example, expense or lack of burial space). The Church re-stated what the 1962 document said: that the ashes are to be given proper burial in a cemetery. They are not to be scattered, kept at home, or made into jewelry or some other kind of keepsake. The ashes are human remains, and are to be treated with the respect that is due to anybody buried in the cemetery. To be human is to be body <u>and</u> soul. God made both; both are important; both are sanctified in the sacraments. The body is the instrument by which the soul serves God; for example, our eyes read God's word; our feet carry us to people in need; our hands re-shape God's world to make it useful for people today. What may be ashes now was once a human being, and the Church wants it to be treated with honor.

BLESSED SACRAMENT ADORATION: I just saw a notice that the Archdiocese of New York is offering a pre-election Holy Hour in a few parishes in each of its counties in order to encourage people to pray for our country and for wisdom for its leaders. Since I will be on retreat from November 7 - 11, we can't exactly copy them, but we do have a Holy Half-Hour after the 8:00 a.m. Mass on November 1st. There are also adoration times scheduled on First Friday, November 4th from roughly 8:45 a.m. to noon and on Saturday, November 5th during Confessions (3:00 p.m. until the end of the Rosary before Mass.) I would like to especially encourage people to pray for our country at these opportunities during this coming week. And don't neglect to vote. Patriotism is a Catholic virtue, and taking part in elections is at the heart of patriotism.
