


PRAYER SERVICE: Now that the World Series is over, there will be a special prayer service for all Tigers and Reds fans. We will sing our favorite hymn: "They fly forgotten as a dream dies at the Opening Day." Take heart, everyone. Pitchers and catchers report to spring training in ten weeks. By the way, I told the upper grades on Thursday that things could have been much worse; they should remember the poor children in Minneapolis who are Twins fans. I don't think our kids were impressed.

CHANGES FOR HOLY COMMUNION MINISTERS: Starting on the First Sunday of Advent, there will be a change in the timing for ministers of Holy Communion to approach the altar. What we are doing now is not strictly according to rules. An alert Holy Communion minister noticed the procedure that is followed at St. Mary's in Van Wert, which is much more in keeping with what Rome wants. Starting on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27, the Holy Communion ministers will stand in front of the front pew at the Lamb of God. They will not approach the altar until the priest has received Communion. In parts of the world (maybe even in parts of the United States), there have been abuses that made it look as if the Communion distributors were somehow concelebrating the Mass. This abuse impacts our whole theology of Mass as the sacrifice of Christ, and our theology of priesthood. It is the sort of thing that Rome is very sensitive to. I believe that we need to respect that.

Soon after November 27, we will be implementing a system of <u>coordinators</u> for the ministers of Holy Communion. We will be asking the Holy Communion ministers to stop in the sacristy and sign in before each Mass, so that the coordinator (and priest) know that you are present. We would like to eliminate the uncertainty before Masses about who the Communion ministers will be. We would especially like to eliminate the embarrassment caused when too many Communion ministers approach the altar, and someone has to return to their place. There will be six coordinators in all; they will serve every other month, three being on duty while three are off. In a situation where a Communion minister has to be absent, makes a good-faith effort to find a substitute but cannot, the coordinator will obtain someone's services, preferably before Sunday, but before Mass if necessary.

NEW ACOLYTE: Our parishioner Don Siefker is studying in preparation to be ordained a permanent deacon in September 2017. A few Saturdays ago, Bishop Thomas entrusted the ministry of acolyte to him. (This is the ministry that Norm Schnipke already carries out.) It means that he is an ordinary minister of Holy Communion with a life-long appointment, rather than a two-year term. He is also allowed to help purify the sacred vessels after Holy Communion. You can expect to see him at the altar soon. We congratulate Don, and look forward to his ordination to the diaconate.

PRIESTS' RETREAT: I will be at the Toledo diocesan priests' retreat this week from Monday afternoon until Friday noon. There will be no Tuesday Mass. Father John Stites will have school Masses on Wednesday and Thursday; Father Steve Blum will celebrate the all-school Mass on Friday. In the event that school is cancelled or delayed, these Masses will be cancelled. If the school buses can't run, we can't ask a priest to drive from Defiance or Delphos in unsafe conditions!
