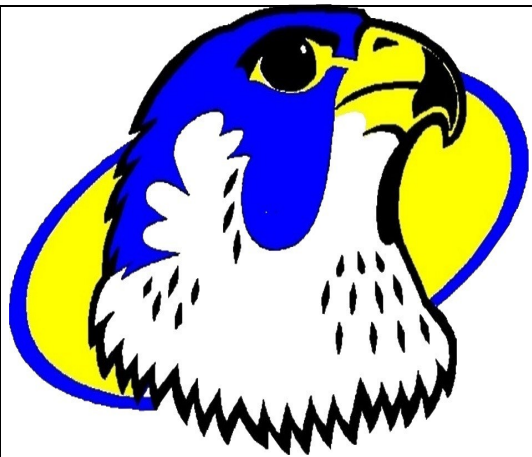
IN GOD'S HANDS: In your charity, please remember to pray for Mary Rita Fischbach of Sts. Peter and Paul Parish. For years, she and her husband Jim volunteered at Hilty Home. For years after that, she was a resident at Hilty who suffered greatly. Our parishioners ministered to her and her husband Jim, who continues to live at Hilty. May she be at peace in God's Kingdom.

COMING CAPITAL CAMPAIGN: The Finance, Parish and School Councils met jointly on November 2 to discuss multiple repairs and upgrades to our buildings. These upgrades and repairs are not optional. If neglected, they will only result in more expensive repairs later on. The older portion of the school needs a new roof. Even the patches on the roof have patches on them. All three of our buildings need some mortar joints repaired. Both the school and the church have exterior steps that are becoming hazardous. The interior of the church hasn't been painted in almost 30 years. We need to repair flashing and drip edges on the church roof to keep the rain out when the wind blows from the wrong direction. And there are other smaller repairs that need to be made. We are in the process of gathering bids. The cost of these repairs is probably 3-4 times as much as the money we have in the bank, and so we will need your help. Please watch the bulletin, and expect a letter in the mail to explain these matters in greater depth.

OVERTHROWING GOD'S ENEMIES: Jesus has entered Jerusalem, and His disciples are acting like tourists, checking out all the magnificent buildings. Jesus shocks them by saying it will all be destroyed. And no wonder; it's all controlled by enemies of God's Kingdom. Our Psalm prophesied that God will make His victory known, and that He is coming to judge the earth. There will be great distress, because some people will find that they have chosen the wrong side. Jesus teaches His disciples to be ready, because God's enemies will fight back.

Is the end near? That's not ours to know, not even after last week's election. All we really have is the present in which we can draw nearer to God – or refuse to. We need to concern ourselves with what kind of witnesses to Jesus we are. Saint Paul tells us not to be led astray by people who predict spectacular, “Left Behind” events as signs of the end times. Instead Christians are to “do their work quietly and earn their own living.” We should do all things in goodness now, offering people a true sign of the End Times, when the goodness of God will be all in all. When will that be? God knows.
