In order to keep the Loan Closet full, the Council relies on generous donations from the community. Our supply of items constantly changes depending on the needs of older adults as well as donations received. The Council will accept most small medical equipment as long as it is in good repair. The church looks plain and ordinary. And the Missalette confirms our suspicions when it tells us that we've got to face seven weeks of Ordinary Time. What store labels its wares as "ordinary"? How uninspiring!

But maybe there  $\underline{is}$  some inspiration here after all. The faith is not just something reserved for extraordinary moments and seasons. It is meant to be lived in all the ordinary moments of life, too; it is meant to be lived throughout the year.

The liturgical readings and prayers of Ordinary Time emphasize discipleship. What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus in matters involving money, time, priorities, etc.? How do we encounter the Kingdom of God and perceive it in our daily lives? What are the conditions of discipleship? How will we ultimately be judged? These are some of the themes of Ordinary Time.

So encounter God in the "ordinary," in the time throughout the year, even when on vacation this coming summer. There is no vacation from our vocation. Do not miss what God is doing, even in the ordinary. (Adapted from Msgr. After Bishop Barron defines the sin, he names a virtue we can cultivate to counter that habit, and an example from the life of Mary to reflect on.
