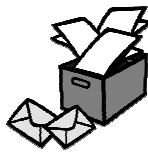

A Note from Fr. Tom

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK: Catholic Schools Week always occurs at the end of January, with a round of special activities to make us reflect on who we really are. Probably the most significant activity for us will be the Mass at Leipsic for all three Catholic schools of the county on Thursday at 10 a.m. Thursday happens to be the feast of the Presentation; in the Gospel, the aged Simeon proclaims that Jesus is a light of revelation for the Gentiles, and the glory of God's people Israel. I will be preaching, and I will ask how Catholic schools share the light of Christ with the world.

We excel at the 3 R's; I was happy to see so many St. Anthony names on the honor roll at Columbus Grove High School. When I visit classrooms, our kids ask thought-provoking questions. Most importantly however, they develop a hunger for a relationship with Jesus Christ, and a desire to know more. We put a lot of money into our school, and it's worth every penny. Looking at our kids and listening to them makes me confident that there will be a strong Catholic parish at St. Anthony long after the present parents and grandparents have gone to their heavenly reward.

Thanks to our principal, our teachers and all our staff. Their example of living the Gospel, and their vision of what education needs to include in the 21st century have made us what we are. Thanks to our parents who are the children's first religious educators, and to the parishioners who take such a healthy interest in the school.

MARCH FOR LIFE: The March for Life happened yesterday, January 27. We've had petitions at Mass for all the marchers, especially for those from our parish. Sorry to say, I read a dissent from the March for Life in a Sunday bulletin from another parish, quite some distance from here. The writer said that many of the marchers are anti-abortion but not pro-life. (I don't know how he knows that.) His argument is that abortion is not the cause of all of our evil in our society but it is a symptom. He insisted that if you really wanted to reduce the raw numbers of abortions, seriously start to deal with social justice issues in our culture: hunger, poverty, racism, and unemployment.

Now I don't deny that there are quite a few social justice issues that we haven't dealt with effectively – not under either political party. But I don't think that abortion is the result of hunger, poverty, racism and unemployment. Abortion is the result of moral relativism, i.e. of an attitude that says that I can have my own truth, whatever I decide is good for me is good, and no one dares call my opinion into question. Abortion is also a result of what Pope Francis calls the "throwaway culture." Anything or anyone who is inconvenient or who seems to be useless should be gotten rid of. A child is arriving at the wrong time in the mother's life – abort her. Amniocentesis shows that a child will have birth defects – abort him. An adult is now in her nineties; she can't communicate very well and has one health crisis after another – euthanize her. I'm afraid that even if we had full employment, a fridge full of food in every home, and no discrimination, we'd still have abortion because these material blessings won't overcome moral relativism or the "throwaway culture." If we are going to bring an end to abortion, we need a spiritual renewal.

And that's why from time to time I will preach about, or write about abortion. Catholics need a reminder that something is really rotten in our culture, and we need to stand up against it. We also need to stand for the people our society neglects or despises: immigrants, unborn persons, elderly persons and all the rest. The bulletin writer said that priests preach pro-life homilies because they want people to say, "Great job, Father!" There is a high percent of pro-choice Catholics, however. Every time I've gotten lambasted in the vestibule for my homily, it's been for pro-life things I've said. I believe that priests and deacons need to keep preaching the message because there are things in our culture that Catholics need to be inoculated against. Priests and people need to be reminded to remain faithful and on task in the pro-life struggle.

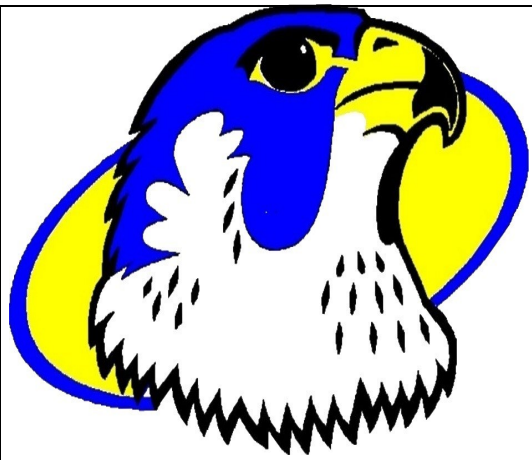

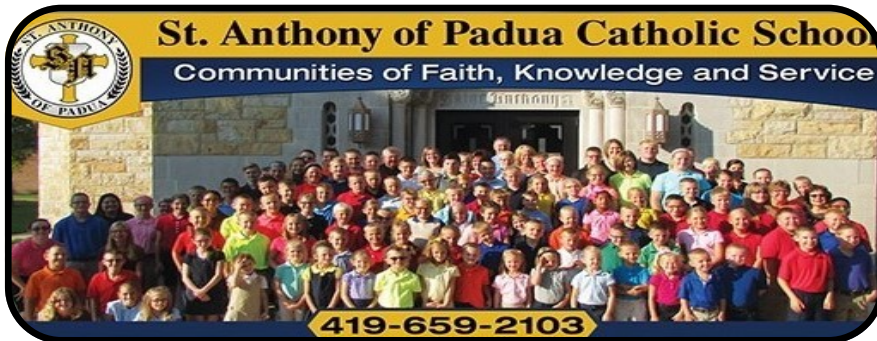
