21st CENTURY FIX-UP CAMPAIGN: With support from the Parish Council, School Council, Finance Committee and Maintenance Committee, I announced the 21st Century Fix-Up Campaign two weeks ago. Letters have gone to parishioners' homes, and will arrive in the next few days. Please consider what you can do to help. We will need as many people on board as possible since the goal is high: \$320,000. To repair the mortar joints on all our buildings and to waterproof them (including the bell tower) is going to be very expensive. Please know that this campaign is for all givers, not for major donors only. We can't all give equally, but we are all equally necessary, and all equally valued in the Lord's eyes.

SALT OF THE EARTH, LIGHT OF THE WORLD: Last Sunday, we heard how Jesus came down the mountain, just like Moses with the Commandments. He didn't deliver an extra set of commandments, but with the Beatitudes He showed us the full meaning of the Commandments that Moses received. Christian life is growth in amazement and gratitude for what God has done. The more grateful and amazed we become, the freer we are of the desire for money, reputation or power. The more grateful and amazed we become, the more aware we become of God's pure, unbounded love for the other people around us. Then we will want to share the Good News with them, preaching more by our actions than our words. That's how we truly become salt of the earth and light of the world.
