Why Pray the Stations of the Cross? ~ The Stations of the Cross are an ancient tradition in the Catholic Church going back to the fourth century when Christians went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Like many of our Catholic traditions, the Stations of the Cross can be rich, deep, and meaningful, but at the same time we can lose sight of their significance and how to relate them to our everyday lives. Reason #3 from our Holy Father on why we should pray the Stations of the Cross.

3. They Remind Us That Jesus Suffers With Us

"The Cross of Christ bears the suffering and the sin of mankind, including our own. Jesus accepts all this with open arms, bearing on His shoulders our crosses and saying to us: 'Have courage! You do not carry your cross alone! I carry it with you. I have overcome death and I have come to give you hope, to give you life.'" Pope Francis, World Youth Day, Way of the Cross, July 26, 2013

21st CENTURY FIX-UP CAMPAIGN: Generous gifts from parishioners continue to arrive here. We now have \$104,045.00 on hand from 143 donors. These figures include \$1000 from our own Knights of Columbus, and gifts from the family in memory of Leroy and Mary Fischer. The Maintenance Committee is meeting this afternoon (Wed., March 8) to examine bids on tuck-pointing and waterproofing. Work will begin after the weather gets warm and stays warm. As the Parish and Finance Councils approve expenditures, we will keep you informed.

TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD: In the Catholic tradition, we read the account of the Transfiguration on the Second Sunday of Lent, from either Matthew, Mark or Luke, depending on where we are in our 3-year cycle of readings. It's a Lenten reading because the event happens when Jesus is on His way to Jerusalem to suffer and die. The Transfiguration means that it isn't just another man who will suffer and die; it's the Son of God, the second Person of the Trinity, God Himself Who will lay down His human life for sinful humanity. This is the reason the Father has sent Him into the world. He proclaims to us: "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." And He gives us our commission: "Listen to Him." In the Protestant tradition, Transfiguration Sunday is the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. My Protestant colleagues at our local churches assure me that they read this Gospel at this time of year for the very same reasons.

Scott Hahn, an outstanding Catholic writer about Scripture and doctrine, has even more to say about the Transfiguration. The story shows Jesus as a new and greater Moses. In Exodus 24:34, Moses takes companions up a mountain and is overshadowed by the shining cloud of God's presence. He too speaks with God, and his face and clothing become radiant. Scott Hahn calls us to look beyond Moses, to what our second reading from 2nd Timothy calls "the grace bestowed on us in Christ Jesus <u>before time began</u>."(2nd Timothy 1:9) God bound Himself in covenants with Abraham (Genesis 17:15) and the people of Israel (Exodus 19). He then promises to give all people a new heart and a new spirit (Jeremiah 33: 26). Now God calls us to a holy life, as Paul wrote to Timothy. As God the Father delivered His Son Jesus from death, He will deliver us too. We trust in God's fidelity, just as we sang in today's Psalm. (Psalm 33: 22)
