A Note from Fr. Tom

"THE LIGHT IS ON" The Bishop has asked all the parishes of the Diocese to join in making Confession available on Wednesday, April 5 from 4 to 7 p.m. That will happen here at St. Anthony. Our parish Penance Service will be on Thursday, March 30 at 7 p.m. with four priests available. Saturday Confession times on April 8 will be extended, taking place from 2:00 until 4:00 p.m. There will also be Confessions after the morning Mass on Tuesday, April 11.

THE WOMAN AT THE WELL: Some of us will remember Peter, Paul and Mary singing "Jesus met the woman at the well... and He told her everything she'd ever done." The woman was thirsty: thirsty for water, thirsty for a few shreds of dignity that would come from going to the well when no one else was there, and (although she didn't know it) thirsty for God. Jesus was thirsty too. He wanted a drink of water, but He also thirsted for the conversion of sinners, and for people who would have God's peace in their hearts. Jews and Samaritans had hated one another for centuries; you can read the whole story in 2nd Kings 17. Samaritans were despised for intermarrying with foreign nations and for worshipping on Mount Gerizim, not in Jerusalem. Jesus tells the woman that the hour is coming when God's true worshippers will worship in spirit and truth. The hour will be when Jesus dies on the cross, the soldier pierces His side with a lance, and from Him flow blood and water to wash away all enmities – new enmities and ancient ones. In this Eucharist, the Lord now is in our midst—as He was at the Rock of Horeb and at the well of Jacob.

In the "today" of our Liturgy, He calls us to believe: "I am He" Who has come to pour out the love of God into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. How can we continue to worship as if we don't understand? How can our hearts remain hardened? (*Adapted from an e-mail by Dr. Scott Hahn entitled "This Sunday's Bible Reflection."*)

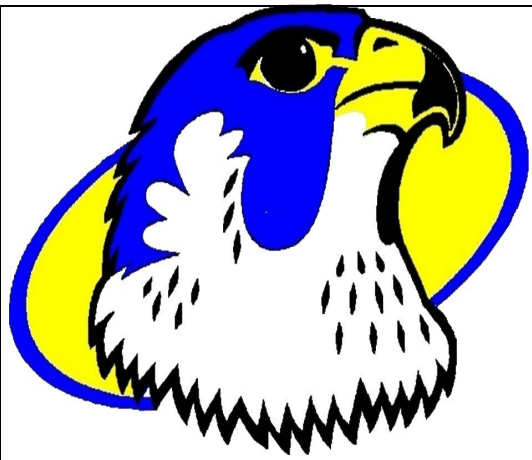

The High Flyers is a leadership group that was established three years ago at St. Anthony School in an effort to allow students in 6th, 7th, and 8th grade to become more involved in the school. The group not only helps the students learn about leadership, but also life skills such as responsibility and service. The High Flyers meet after school about once a month to discuss ideas about potential activities/projects for the group. Some examples of what they have done include cleaning up around the Columbus Grove Swimming Pool, visiting the nursing home and playing bingo with the residents, purchasing a memorial block for the wall at school, and purchasing a banner with the school prayer which hangs in the school's gymnasium. They will also be acting out the Living Stations of The Cross during Lent this year. The students are also responsible for thinking of ways to raise funds to carry out their ideas. They have held post-game gatherings, sold trail mix and candy grams to the students of St Anthony School, held cake raffles during junior high basketball games, and raffled off an Ohio State rock.

The group's most recent project was purchasing a cross which was placed in the school gym above the school prayer banner. The High Flyers, along with help from the Knights of Columbus, purchased the cross which was hand-crafted by Bill Hohenbrink. The cross is made out of Acacia Wood, which is the same wood that was used to build the Ark of the Covenant. Mr. Hohenbrink also used Rosewood, which signifies Jesus's Blood.
