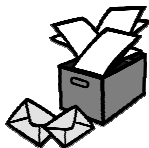

Why Pray the Stations of the Cross? ~ The Stations of the Cross are an ancient tradition in the Catholic Church going back to the fourth century when Christians went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Like many of our Catholic traditions, the Stations of the Cross can be rich, deep, and meaningful, but at the same time we can lose sight of their significance and how to relate them to our everyday lives. Reason #3 from our Holy Father on why we should pray the Stations of the Cross.

5. They Help Us Make a Decision for or Against Christ

"The Cross of Christ reveals a judgment, namely that God, in judging us, loves us. Let us remember this: God judges us by loving us. If I embrace His love, then I am saved, if I refuse it, then I am condemned, not by Him, but by my own self, because God never condemns. He only loves and saves."

A Note from Fr. Tom

PENANCE SERVICE and INDIVIDUAL CONFESSIONS: Lent becomes a little more somber as we turn to St. John's Gospel in our weekday readings, and reflect on just who Jesus is. When the season deepens, then it's time for Confessions. We will have our parish Penance Service this Thursday at 7 p.m.

The Bishop has asked all parishes of the diocese to offer Confession from 4 to 7 p.m. on Wednesday, April 5. That will be the case here at St. Anthony. Thankfully the Altar-Rosary Society will be saving a dinner for me, so no one's penance will be to run home and make me a sandwich!

Other Confession times will be on Saturday, April 8 from 2 to 4 p.m. There will also be Confessions after 8:30 a.m. Mass on Tuesday, April 11.

"SEVEN DEADLY SINS" – FINAL REPORT: On March 20, we had our final session on the seven deadly sins and the virtues that counteract them. I learned a lot both from the videos by Bishop Robert Barron, and from the discussions with parishioners. I'd like to report on a few things I learned.

First, I learned that pride is the deadliest of the deadly. Pride is not saying, "Boy, my fields look better than Bob's." That's a minor-league sin. Pride is the sin of Adam and Eve in the garden, who said, "I know better than God. If God knew this situation as well as I do, he'd approve my way." That's the sin that leads to all other sins. The counteracting virtue is humility. Humility does not say, "I'm worthless, I'm not capable of helping." Humility is the attitude of Mary, who said "Let it be done to me according to your word." In other words, I know my gifts and talents, and I'm submitting them to God's plan for me.

Another surprise to me was the classic definition of sloth. Sloth is not sitting back in your recliner, watching the Sweet 16 and having a beverage or 2 when there are chores to be done. Again, that's minor-league. Sloth is distaste for spiritual things. Sloth is putting off prayer, Mass, or spiritual reading because "they're boring", or because "Sunday is my only day to sleep in." You can be a ball of energy at your chores, but still be slothful when it comes to things of God. The opposite virtue is zeal. Mary went in haste up into the hill country when she heard that God had given Elizabeth a child. Jesus says that our zeal for the hungry, the imprisoned, the sick, and other neglected people is the standard that God will judge us on.

One last surprise was the definition of lust. Lust means using someone sexually as if he or she were a thing, not a person. Calling lust a deadly sin is not the Church's way of saying sex is evil. God made us men and women so that we could enjoy one another in the perpetual, faithful covenant of marriage, and then share life with the children that come from that union. Lust is a sin of exploiting someone else to get what I want, and discarding that person when he or she no longer meets my needs. Chastity is the opposite virtue. That is the virtue of relating to other people in accord with my state in life, knowing my commitments and being faithful to them. Mary is the model of chastity because of her "yes" to God and her "yes" to the family God gave her.

I learned this after the last session. The Latin word for "gluttony" is "gula." "Gula" is also the Latin word for "wolverine." How can anybody cheer for a team that is named after a deadly sin?

If anyone would like to learn more, you may borrow the DVD and a workbook from our library on the landing in the back of church.

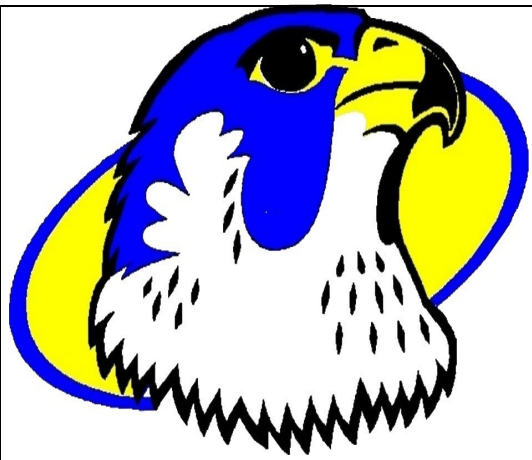
