Like many of our Catholic traditions, the Stations of the Cross can be rich, deep, and meaningful, but at the same time we can lose sight of their significance and how to relate them to our everyday lives. Reason #3 from our Holy Father on why we should pray the Stations of the Cross.


SCRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: We had a Penance Service for grades 2 to 8 last Tuesday. When that was over, I went to Kalida for their adult Penance Service. Our seating arrangement was the usual: grades 2 and 3 up front, and older students to the back. We sang "Were You There?" for an opening song, and the kids (especially the younger ones) put their entire heart and soul into it. Those who come to school Masses know what I mean. The examination of conscience was in question form. Afterwards I learned that as I asked each question, the second graders were shaking their heads "yes" or "no". Talk about being up front about your sins! How would you feel about confessing in public?

Father Mark Hoying from Kalida heard most of our second graders' Confessions. Afterward at Kalida's Penance Service he talked about that experience. He said that our young ones are so happy to be forgiven by God that they have no fear and no sense of embarrassment about confessing. It was an experience of pure joy for them. I was stationed in the back of church, and mostly heard junior-high Confessions. They were more reserved, but you could sense that they still believed sincerely in the mercy they were receiving.

Now how about us adults as we take advantage of this week's opportunities to confess? We can't call up the joy of second graders, but we can recall what a wise priest once said: "Confession isn't about how bad you've been; Confession is about how good God is." We'll have Confessions this Tuesday after 6:30 p.m. Mass (along with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament), on Wednesday from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. as part of the Diocesan "The Light Is On" program, and next Saturday, April 8th, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. (Along with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament). On Palm Sunday, there is a Penance Service as St. Rose at 3:00 p.m. Ottawa has Penance Services at 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 10th. We'll have Confessions at St. Anthony's on Tuesday, April 11th after the 8:00 a.m. Mass (with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament). If none of these times are possible within your schedule, please call the rectory for an individual appointment.

PALM SUNDAY: Lent is passing us in a hurry! Next week is the last Sunday of Lent, Palm Sunday. Each Mass will begin with the blessing of palms, the reading of the Gospel of the Lord's entry into Jerusalem, and a procession. Weather permitting, we will begin Mass on the front sidewalk. Weather <u>not</u> permitting, we will begin Mass in the vestibule. In either case, you are invited to assemble with me and with the altar servers.

SACRED TRIDUUM: Lent ends with the Sacred Triduum, the Sacred three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. These are the three most important celebrations of the Church year, and we've always had excellent attendance. The Mass of the Lord's Supper will be at 7:00 p.m.; the Liturgy of the Lord's Suffering and Death will take place on Good Friday at 1:00 p.m.; the Easter Vigil will start at 8:30 p.m. on Holy Saturday. There is no Saturday Mass before the Vigil.
