A Note from Fr. Tom

IF IT WEREN'T FOR EASTER, nothing we do would make sense. The values we teach in our school and in our CCD make sense because Jesus' resurrection promises us happiness with God forever. Because of the resurrection, our other church celebrations are not just empty talk – nice people saying nice things to one another in the nicest way possible. No, the reading of the Word, the sacraments (especially the Eucharist) are encounters with the Lord of Life. Because of the resurrection, our pro-life work and our ministry to people facing an emergency make sense. There may be social-service agencies that do this sort of thing better than we, but we do it in order to witness to the ultimate dignity of each human person.

"Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (St. Paul, 1st Corinthians 15:20). Because Christ is risen, we can be sure that life does not end with death, and there is perfect, unending happiness for His followers. Because Christ is risen, we can encounter Him in the sacraments, and receive His power to live His life of forgiveness, service, and obedience to God. Because Christ is risen, we have a mission to witness to the value of every human life, including the people whom the world writes off as being the wrong color, speaking the wrong language, not having power or influence, not having a perfect body, or coming at an inconvenient time.


I hope that our celebration of Lent, Holy Week and Easter has helped you to see the risen Christ making a difference in you and through you. Thanks to everyone who helped us celebrate in a way fitting the Easter mystery, whether you read, distributed Holy Communion, served at the altar, took up the offering, decorated or cleaned. I also want to thank leaders and participants in "That Man Is You", "Walking with Purpose", and "Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues." You helped us reach people with the most important message of all, and you helped yourself to grow in the life of the risen Lord.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: Saint John Paul II re-named the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. On that day we read how the risen Jesus shared with the apostles and their successors His own power to forgive sins. At 3 p.m. next Sunday, we will have a Divine Mercy devotion, consisting of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, Vespers, and Benediction.

FLOWER FUND-RAISER: Our young people are raising money to help at least some of them attend the National Catholic Youth Conference, which will take place in Indianapolis this fall. Their first effort is a sale of flowers for your yard. Order forms are at the doors. Flowers will be available for pick-up here at church on Mother's Day weekend (May 13-14).

This will be the third or fourth year that we have sent representatives to NCYC. Our students come back grateful for the inspiring Masses, dynamic speakers, and other events that help them grow in their commitment to Jesus Christ.

HOSPITAL VISITS: In my first years of priesthood, churches were automatically notified when a parishioner was admitted to the hospital. In the late 1980s, privacy laws changed this. The hospital cannot call the patient's church unless the patient gives permission. Sometimes hospital personnel are in a great hurry (usually in the emergency room), and don't have time to inquire about informing a church. If you want a visit by someone from St. Anthony, the surest way to get one is to have a family member call the rectory.

Information on the Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund can be found on the www.nosf.org website under Scholarships/Downloads . The deadline to apply is Friday, April 28, 2017. Applying to NOSF is easy and can be done on any device - computer, mobile phone, etc. Visit http://tinyurl.com/NOSF17AP for more information or to apply.

Scholarships are available for students who want to attend a private school for grades K-8. Your child may qualify for up to 75% of tuition or a maximum of \$1,500 at the school of your choice based on your family's annual household income. Scholarship payments are made directly to the school on behalf of your family as long as you remain eligible. You can apply online at http://tinyurl.com/ NOSF17AP and are now able to select a language in the upper right corner of the form. Or call (419) 720-7048 to request an application for the 2017-2018 school year. Application deadline is Friday, April 28, 2017.

St Anthony Parish sponsors The GUARDIAN ANGEL TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Mission: To provide a Catholic education by assisting struggling families with financial assistance and removing some of the burden of tuition fees. Families wishing to participate in the tuition assistance program must apply every year. Receiving assistance one year does not automatically ensure assistance the following year. The number of families applying may change and the ranking of each family's need may change each year. The information on the application will only be reviewed by the pastor and principal. To be considered for the Guardian Angel Tuition Assistance Program for the 2017-2018 school year, you must:

- -Be registered by the registration deadline.
- -Complete the entire application by July 1st.

-Attach verification of your income (Last page of your 2016 Federal Tax Return).

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR EDCHOICE?

The following students are eligible to apply for an EdChoice scholarship:-Students currently attending a designated public school in their resident

Students attending a public school in their resident district who will be assigned to one of the designated public schools for the upcoming school

Students currently attending a charter/community school whose assigned home school is designated public school building;

Students eligible to enter kindergarten for fall 2017 (and who will be age 5 by 1/1/2018) who would be assigned to one of the designated public schools; or

Students enrolling in an Ohio school for the first time who would be assigned to one of the designated public schools for the upcoming school year.

Students who DO NOT meet any of the preceding eligibility criteria may still be eligible for the EdChoice "expansion" scholarship if they meet the following criteria:

Student is eligible to enter kindergarten, first, second, third or fourth grade for fall 2017; "Student does not live in the Cleveland Municipal School District; and ©Family household income is at or below 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

The first application period begins February 1 and ends April 30, 2017. The second application period begins July 1, and ends July 31, 2017. Families must contact the participating private school/ provider and complete the enrollment/admission process for that school. Once students have been accepted for enrollment at a participating private school/provider for fall 2017, they can then apply for an EdChoice Scholarship through the participating private school/provider. Participating private schools/providers can enter scholarship applications for students through the secure online application system.
