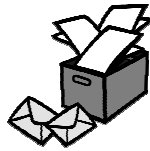

A Note from Fr. Tom

MUCH THANKS to everybody who made Holy Week such a beautiful experience. In thanking all the ministers, I should have remembered to thank the congregation. The parishioners put their entire hearts and souls into worshipping God and thanking Him for His Son's redeeming work. Just as an example, I had a view of the Adoration of the Cross on Good Friday that almost no one else had. From my chair I could see our oldest parishioners struggle to the front to venerate the cross; I saw little children who were happy and yet in awe that they were approaching Jesus; I saw their older sisters and brothers who were embarrassed by being the center of attention for that moment when they were at the cross but came forward nonetheless.

We had a crowd for the Easter Vigil even though there were no baptisms or confirmations. People simply know that that is the year's most important liturgy. And we had overwhelming crowds on Easter morning. Thanks to all who participated. I'm hoping that having greeters at the doors made everyone feel that they had an important part to play in our assembly, and that we encouraged them to be back soon.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: Divine Mercy Sunday is derived from the visions of Jesus that St. Faustina had a few years before World War II. For a number of years, officials in Rome viewed the devotion with suspicion, thinking it smacked too much of Polish nationalism. It seemed that they had gotten hold of a bad translation of St. Faustina's writings. The devotion had to wait for a Pope who rarely needed help from a translator; St. John Paul II could see clearly that the message was universal. He wrote an encyclical *Dives in misericordia* (Rich in Mercy) in November 1980, about 2 years after becoming Pope. It is a piece of writing that deserves more study.

The Holy Father said that with all our technological advances, there seems to be no need for mercy in our world, as if we possessed the answers for everything. Yet some of the forces we have unleashed threaten to enslave us, or even destroy us. We have to learn from God Who began by giving us the world as so generous a gift. On the contrary, God is especially close to people who are close to losing their dignity and even their lives. He sent us Jesus to be the image of His mercy; Jesus accepted that vocation when He first spoke in public and quoted Isaiah: "He has sent me to bring good news to the poor."

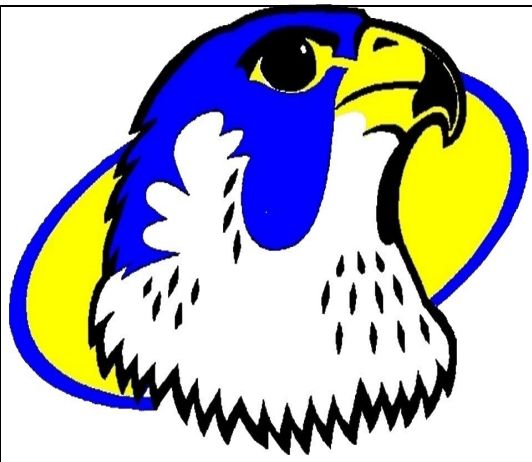
God has also sent us Jesus to demand that we guide our lives by His love and mercy. He stated that love of God and love of neighbor are the heart of the Law; He went even farther and said, "Love your enemy." Saint John Paul II then devotes an entire chapter to the parable of the Prodigal Son, and then gets into God's mercy as we see it in the mystery of Jesus' cross and resurrection. Jesus shows us mercy in spite of our sins; He does it in order to draw mercy forth from us. His death for sinners and His resurrection to give sinners life are the final sign of just who God is. As Jesus said, "Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father."

The Pope then devotes many paragraphs to Mary as the Mother of Mercy, the human being who was privileged to give God's Son a human body. In saying "yes" to this vocation, Mary has a unique position in bringing God's mercy to the world. This role would take her all the way to the foot of the Cross, where Jesus would give her to us as our Mother.

St. John Paul then talks about the merciless character of our world. War remains a serious threat, and an increasing one. We share resources in such an unequal way. Some live amid plenty while others lack the basic necessities of life. If we meet Jesus frequently in the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist, then we can speak His mercy to a merciless world. More importantly, we can live His mercy in a merciless world. We will find that we are not only the givers of mercy to the poor; we also receive mercy from them. We will find ourselves in solidarity with people who we thought are totally different from us.

LOOKING AHEAD TO NEXT YEAR: We will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Thomas in Rosary Cathedral on Saturday, March 24, 2018 at 11 a.m. We will share the liturgy with 3 or 4 other parishes, but the Cathedral setting is unique in its beauty. We can all look forward to a wonderful celebration of this great sacrament.
