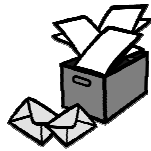

A Note from Fr. Tom

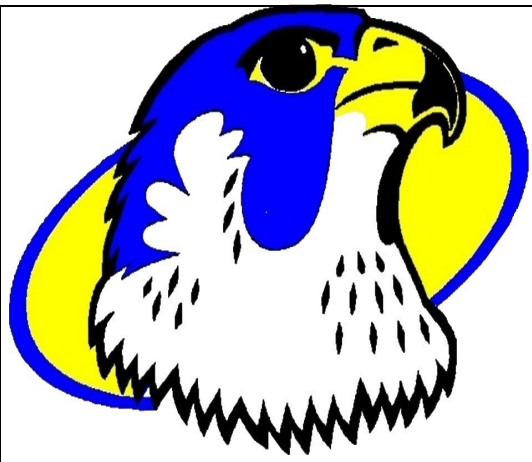
FIRST COMMUNION DAY: Everybody remembers his or her First Communion Day. Mine was May 6, 1956 at 9 a.m. Mass. It was at an early Mass because those were the days of fasting from midnight before receiving Holy Communion. I remember the closeness of kneeling at the altar rail and receiving Jesus for the first time, clouds of incense, and our three priests decked out in really elegant gold vestments for a solemn high Mass. I remember that we had to sing a hymn in Polish as we marched in. (How did we manage that?) I also remember being famished at the end of Mass, and really looking forward to the eggs and sausage that Mom would be fixing.

What memories are we creating for this year's First Communicants? I don't mean the gold vestments or the incense, and I hope they remember something more than the cake that Grandma decorated for them. But come to think of it, maybe those are important memories, especially if they point to a greater reality. I hope our First Communicants remember that today is the day they took another step forward in their membership in the Catholic community, and I hope they especially remember that this is the day that the Lord Jesus personally fed them with His body and blood. Thanks to their parents and teachers who helped prepare them for this day, and who promise to assist their continued growth in the faith, especially by habitually receiving Jesus on Sunday.

100TH ANNIVERSARY: May 13 is the 100th anniversary of the apparition of Mary at Fatima, Portugal. We ordinarily don't have a Saturday morning Mass, but this occasion is special. Mary appeared during the horrors of World War I to simple children from poor families; her stress was on world peace, prayer, and the consecration of Russia to her Immaculate Heart. Russia still has its issues that need to be prayed over, but now is the time to consecrate everyone else, including ourselves, or we could have a war that would make World War I look like flag football. Communism may no longer be the enemy, but atheistic secularism certainly is.

I've invited the parishes of Allen and Putnam Counties that aren't having a special Mass or Rosary devotion that morning to join us; I've also invited my friends from the former Our Lady of Fatima Parish in Lyons, Ohio. Maybe we'll have a crowd at 8 a.m. on Saturday, May 13.

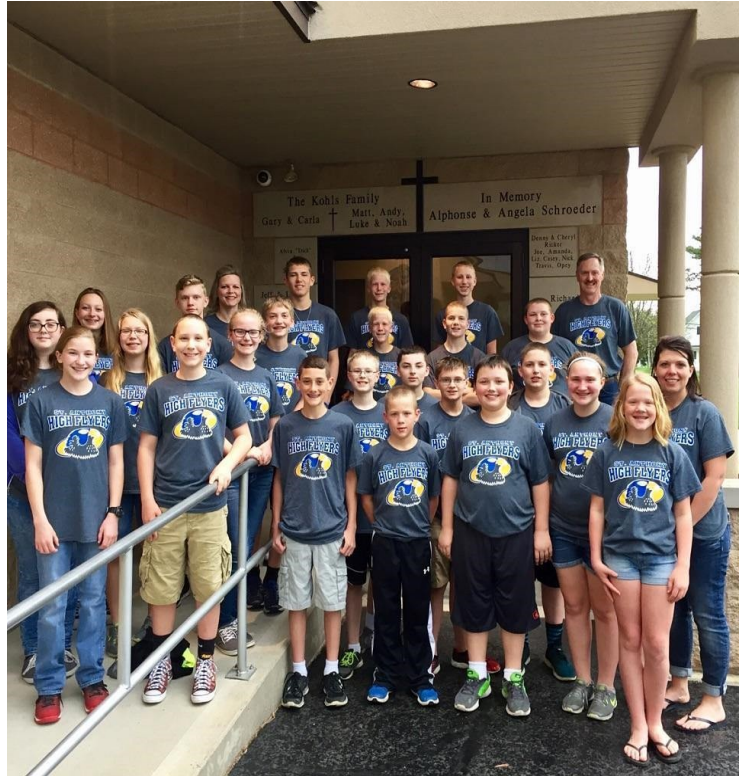
