OFFERTORY GIFTS: Bringing up the Offertory Gifts to the altar is a wonderful opportunity for persons and families to take an active part in the celebration of the Eucharist. At each Mass, the gifts of bread and wine, as well as the collection and prayer intentions are presented to the priest. Perhaps you would like to carry up the gifts at a Mass for a special occasion such as an anniversary of a wedding or the death of a loved one, etc., or you may choose to participate just because it's the Lord's Day. If you or your family would like to carry these gifts to the altar, please sign on the sheet on the clipboard at the back of church on the date and time you prefer. Or you may ask for a specific Sunday Mass in advance by calling the parish office.

If no one has requested to carry up the gifts, the ushers may ask you to participate. Please tell them "yes."

OUR LADY OF FATIMA CENTENNIAL: This Saturday, May 13 is the centennial of Mary's first apparition to the children at Fatima, Portugal. CONGRATULATIONS to our graduates! We are very happy because of your achievements in high school, and will continue to pray for you as you work toward your future goals. Whether you stay close to Columbus Grove or move far away, in a sense you will always be part of this faith community, and you will be able to count on our spiritual closeness.

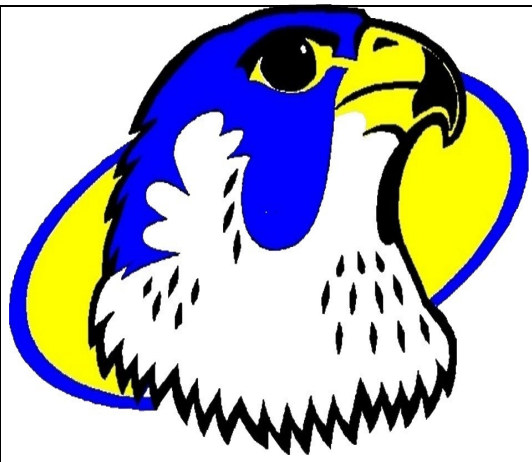
By the way, at the First Communion Mass I pointed out to the first communicants that in ten years we would have a similar celebration for them, and I introduced them as the Columbus Grove High School Class of 2027. They seemed quite happy at the prospect.

GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. The Church needs more shepherds modeled after Jesus, the Shepherd above all others. There were over 300 active diocesan priests when I was ordained (not counting the retirees); now there are fewer than 100. The number of Sisters has declined by an even greater per cent. Why is this? Is it because of all the turmoil in the Church in recent decades? Is it because of a lack of faith in Jesus' presence in the Eucharist? Is it because families are smaller, and people discourage their sons and daughters from religious life because they want to enjoy grandchildren?

I don't think we want to return to the days when Father ruled supreme in his parish, and his word was unquestioned simply because he was a priest. In those days too many people's gifts and talents were ignored. But the truth remains that we are a Eucharistic community. We need priests to gather us together at Jesus' altar, and to offer Jesus' sacrifice for us. We need our sins forgiven; we need our marriages to be sacramental; when sickness strikes, we need Jesus' anointing. And we need to have the Mass readings and the Church's teachings explained from the pulpit. Yes, there are sacrifices involved in being a priest, just as there are sacrifices involved in being a nurse, a doctor or a farmer. No one gets a free ride through life with no hardship.

Bishop Thomas has written a prayer for vocations, which we will pray after Communion. Prayer cards are in the pews. Please take one home, place it where you will see it often, and pray the prayer, perhaps daily. We need an outpouring of the Holy Spirit to set things right for our Church.
