
LAST DAY OF SCHOOL: Another successful school year has come to a conclusion at St. Anthony. The second grade students received First Reconciliation and First Communion, and have gotten a solid grounding in both those sacraments. Grades six and seven have gotten Confirmation preparation under way. (The big day will be Saturday, March 24, 2018 at Rosary Cathedral.) Grade eight has taken the big step out the door of Saint Anthony School with diplomas firmly clutched in their hands. I'm sure they will have a positive impact on Columbus Grove High School, and that they will remain solidly rooted in their parish. Other grades have taken other steps, increasing their knowledge of history and math, as well as knowledge of the Bible and of Church teachings. Congratulations to Mr. Hummel, to the teachers, to the school auxiliary staff, and to the parents for a job well done.

Congratulations as well to our CCD teachers and parents, and thanks to Judy Schroeder who coordinated the program. It was good to work with you, and to see our CCD students at Mass.

**VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL** will take place from June 5 to 9 (Monday through Friday). It's a fun way for children to learn more about their faith, mostly in a non-classroom setting. I think it is a good supplement to the Diocese of Toledo religion curriculum that we follow in both St. Anthony School and in CCD. Registration forms are at all the entrances.

GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT: As Jesus continues to speak at the Last Supper, He tells His disciples about the gift of the Holy Spirit. He refers to the Holy Spirit as the Paraclete (our translation says "Advocate"). In those days, a Paraclete was like a defense attorney, but more. A Paraclete stood by you when you were in trouble, to console and advise you. The first two readings show us how the Holy Spirit was at work. Philip takes the Gospel message to Samaria, where people were hostile to anyone coming from Jerusalem. His God-given success was both unexpected and overwhelming. Clearly the Holy Spirit gave Philip the right words to say. And then the Samaritans are receptive to Peter and John who lay hands on them and give them the gift of the Holy Spirit. (It sounds to me like they were the first bishops to go around confirming people.)

Then in his first letter, Peter has a word for us today. He tells us to be always ready to explain our faith and our hope, but to do it "with gentleness and reverence." How well equipped are you and I to share our faith with people who ask questions? Do we ask God to help us give our answer "with gentleness and reverence", rather than come down on people like a ton of bricks?
