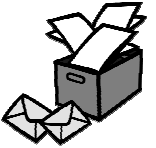

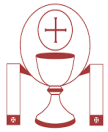

A Note from Fr. Tom

FEAST OF THE ASCENSION: Jesus' ascension reveals to us more of the truth about who God is, who Jesus is, and who we are. God is Lord of all; He is perfect Love Who draws us to Himself. Jesus came to reveal God to us, and to give us the gift of the Holy Spirit so that we would realize that our only happiness is with God, and so that we would always walk on the path that leads to God. And we are creatures whom God empowers to reveal Him to more and more people.

Last Wednesday's Gospel recorded that at the Last Supper, Jesus said that when the Holy Spirit comes, the Holy Spirit will guide us into all truth. Once at the University of Paris, a student asked an impertinent, disrespectful question about God. The professor looked at her and said, "Go to Sunday Mass for a year and then return and ask me that question again."

The professor's response was not just a clever one-liner. If true knowledge of God depends upon being filled with the Holy Spirit, then that knowledge comes from an entire way of life, involving prayer, self-denial, the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and the forgiveness of one's enemies. We don't so much think our way to an understanding of God; we live our way to it.

Saint Thomas Aquinas always said that he owed his theology far more to the persistence of his prayer than to the sharpness of his mind. His penetration of the divine mystery flowed from his life in the Holy Spirit. And so on Ascension Day, as we prepare for Pentecost we pray, "Come, Holy Spirit, come!" (*Adapted in part from Bishop Robert Barron, "Daily Gospel Reflection (05-24-2017)", e-mailed on May 24, 2017*).

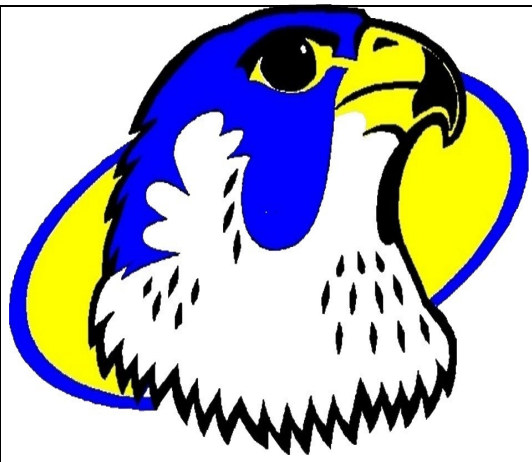
MEMORIAL DAY: The first Memorial Day was May 30, 1868. May 30 was not the anniversary of any major event in our nation's history; some say it was chosen because it was a day on which President Johnson and General Grant did not have other obligations, and were free to take part in a ceremony. The White House website says that May 30 was chosen because the greatest number of flowers would be available for decorating veterans' graves. (Remember that it used to be called Decoration Day.) Nevertheless, the VFW wants to return the observance to May 30 because "changing the date merely to create three-day weekends has undermined the very meaning of the day. No doubt, this has contributed a lot to the general public's nonchalant observance of Memorial Day."

The VFW is right in saying that our observance should be anything but nonchalant. Whatever day we celebrate, it is important to use the holiday to show proper honor to our deceased veterans, especially those who sacrificed everything in battle. There will be a Monday morning Mass here at Saint Anthony at 8:00, and a memorial service at the gazebo in Memorial Park at 10:00. Brief services at Saint Anthony and Truro Cemeteries will follow.

THANKS TO ALL who supported our young people's flower sale to raise funds to help them attend the National Catholic Youth Conference this fall. Gross income was \$1356.00, and the cost of flowers was \$778.80, leaving a net profit of \$577.20.
