

**Some "Choices" Have Victims** ~ A misguided letter published in the Florida Times Union complained, "If you are opposed to abortion, don't have one!" This type of argument is not only sad, but is a typical argument made by those who support abortion and other evils. In fact, it is exactly similar to the rationale that was used to justify keeping slavery legal.

Most people understand that we have to intervene to help the poor, the AIDS victim, the drug addict, the victim of crime and war. Even if we do not know the victims' names, or have never seen their faces, we know it is our business to help them. We do not hear people say, "I would never rape or abuse a child, but if the other person wants to do so, that's their choice." The reason people do not say that, is that they realize that some choices have victims --- and our laws are meant to protect these innocent victims. When somebody's "choice" destroys or threatens somebody else's life, that's everyone's business. It is, after all, the business of all Christians "to love one another...". This requires us to intervene to save our brothers and sisters in need. And no group of human beings needs our help more than the 3,500 innocent babies who are slaughtered each and every day in our nation.

Many oppose abortion but do not think anything can be done. However, the problem is not that there is nothing that can be done, but that there are not enough people doing the perfectly legal, peaceful and effective activities they can do to end abortion. **That is why we all need to get involved!**

## A Note from Fr. Tom

**PRIESTHOOD ORDINATIONS:** Last Friday, May 26 I celebrated the 44<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination. About seven of us gathered for a party at the Rowdy Rooster after Mass. That was about the right size for a celebration; number 44 is not the occasion for major merriment. The next day I went to Toledo for the ordination of Father Tony Coci. I always find priesthood ordination to be an inspiring occasion that helps me to be more dedicated to service in a parish. After the readings, the Bishop asks the candidate, "Do you promise me and my successors obedience and respect?" The candidate says, "I do." Much like wedding vows, that "I do" is a total gamble on God. You never know exactly what God (or the Bishop) is going to ask of you, but you say "yes" to it. Then the candidate lies face down on the floor while we sing the Litany of the Saints, asking everyone from Saint Peter to the Little Flower to Saint John Paul II to support us in prayer in what we are about to do. I always feel that at that moment, some of the old-time priests like Father Finsel and Father Arnoldi are looking down from heaven in prayer too.

The top moment is when the Bishop lays hands on the head of the newly ordained in awesome silence, followed by all the priests laying hands on the head of the one just ordained. Another is when people bring up the bread and wine. Before they are placed on the altar, the Bishop hands them to the newly ordained priest and says, "Accept from the holy people of God the gifts to be offered to him. Know what you are doing, imitate the mystery you celebrate, and model your life on the mystery of the Lord's cross."


Did you notice that I said that we ordained only one man? Next year we'll ordain three, but probably none in 2019. The number of ordinations, and the number of seminarians is up across the United States, but not evenly. Wichita led all US dioceses with ten ordinations this year, and will most likely ordain ten more next year. How is it that a small diocese in Kansas ordains more than New York, Los Angeles, or even Toledo? People propose all kinds of man-made solutions to the shortage of priests, but I'm convinced it's totally in God's hands, and it's beyond anything that we do.

I know that it's important for me to offer good example and to encourage young men privately. I know that Father Matt Rader's work will be important too. Father Rader will be the Diocese's vocations director starting July 1; he has already promised me that he will visit Columbus Grove to spread the good news about priesthood and religious life. Research shows that encouragement from parents is very important too. People who analyze statistics say that the encouragement of the moderator of the parish youth group frequently leads to a decision to study for the priesthood. And I'm sure that the prayers and encouragement of all parishioners is important too.

**HIGH-SCHOOL HONOR ROLL:** By my count, 39 Saint Anthony graduates made the honor roll at Columbus Grove High School in the fourth quarter (11 freshmen, 12 sophomores, 8 juniors and 8 seniors). Congratulations to all of them for their dedication and hard work, congratulations to their parents, and congratulations to the teachers who prepared them for high school.
