INSTALLATION OF HOLY COMMUNION MINISTERS: Next Sunday is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the celebration of Jesus' gift of His Body and Blood to the Church. In odd-numbered years, it is also the day on which terms expire for each parish's ministers of Holy Communion. To be reappointed, they must meet for a continuing education experience, and then have their names presented by the pastor to the Bishop, which I have done. They will be reinstalled with a brief prayer and blessing after the homily at each Mass next Lord's Day. This includes the people who help at Sunday Mass, as well as those who distribute Holy Communion at Hilty Home, or to neighbors or relatives who cannot come to Mass. Certificates of appointment will be on the table in the back of church. If any of the ministers know that they cannot be present, please inform our parish office, and we will make other arrangements.

R.C.I.A.: The Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults will begin on Thursday, September 7 at 7:30 p.m. If the date or time causes inconvenience for our inquirers, we are open to changing it. No adult has entered the Church at St. Anthony for two years now, but I am hopeful that we can invite some people. I would hope that the parishioners would also invite relatives or friends who might be searching for a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ.

What happens at RCIA? First of all, we pray together at the beginning and end of each session. Prayer helps us to be open to the action of the Holy Spirit in the session, and then in the week to come. We look at the Saint of the Week. A team member picks out a favorite saint, tells a little bit about the facts of his or her life, and then says why the saint is important. Our textbook or an appropriate video will then provide the "main course," as we look at some aspect of our Catholic faith. Any necessary announcements will be made, and we will go home, ready for next week. There will be plenty of opportunities to answer questions, even if they are not on the evening's topic. Lots of discussion happens too.

There are also opportunities at Sunday Mass for the inquirers to be introduced to the congregation and prayed for. The first of these will take place in mid-November. There will be others during Lent, including a sending forth to meet the Bishop, probably at Findlay. Reception into the Church will happen at the Easter Vigil, which will take place after dark on Saturday, March 31.

PRIESTHOOD ORDINATION – ONE MORE NOTE: Last week I wrote a few paragraphs on my trip to the Cathedral for the ordination of Father Tony Coci (who, incidentally, is assigned as associate pastor at Tiffin St. Mary and Sycamore St. Pius X.) One phrase from the Bishop's homily is going to stick with me for a long time. "Priesthood is not something you do, primarily. It is something you are, or better still, Someone you become." What a challenge. But in a way it's the challenge that everyone faces who takes his or her faith seriously. We gather in church to come to know Jesus Christ better, so that we can <u>be</u> Christ to others.
