A Note from Fr. Tom

21ST CENTURY FIX-UP CAMPAIGN: The walls of the church have been power-washed, tuck-pointed and sealed. The same work has been done on the yellow brick storage garage. The total cost of these projects was \$48,495. All that remains is to put a finishing coat on the outdoor steps on the sides of the church.

Thanks to everyone who helped with this work of beautifying and preserving our buildings. Parishioners have given \$211,882.81 for our projects. Our cash on hand is \$136,647.81. Of this amount, \$6000 is in the parish checking account; the balance is invested with the Diocese of Toledo, and is earning 2%. We can make withdrawals at any time without penalty.

The next project, a new roof on the older wing of our school, will begin soon. The interior of the church will be painted late October, after this year's last wedding.

GAZEBO: The gazebo south of the parking lot is not part of our Fix-Up Campaign. It is an Eagle Scout project organized and worked on by Jon Smith (St. Anthony School Class of 2014). In order to qualify for Eagle rank, Jon had to organize and work on a project that would beautify or somehow improve his community, and we are the beneficiaries of his work. Thank you, Jon, for remembering us and enhancing our property.

FATHERS DAY: We pause today and thank our fathers for making us the people we are today. A good father shows his son how to be a real man, not by dominating people or situations, but by handing on ideals, showing the dignity of work, living for others, and by giving an example of faith. Fatherhood has been under attack for many years. It all started rather innocently with dads in situation comedies who were lovable goof-offs. Now the attack has worsened with the definition of marriage being changed,, babies conceived in a test tube, and all sorts of manipulations of family structure to assure that the adult parties can "have it all." We thank dads who uphold traditional values, and who put their wives and kids ahead of themselves. In them we see the reflection of the fatherhood of God.

CORPUS CHRISTI, THE BODY AND BLOOD OF THE LORD: Today we celebrate Jesus' real presence in the signs of bread and wine that we use at the altar in memory of His sacrifice on the cross. God doesn't just become man; He becomes our most common foods, bread and wine, that we might welcome Him as food for our souls. Our celebration may be less spectacular than those of other parts of the Church, but it is still our profession of faith. Here at the altar Jesus becomes truly present, and His sacrifice is offered once again for us. What could fill us with more awe?

ONE MORE IMPORTANT FEAST: The feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is this Friday. It is a commemoration of the intensity of Jesus' love for us, in spite of our sins. If you can't come to Mass on Friday, at least take some time to reflect on His mercy, His bounty and His welcome.
