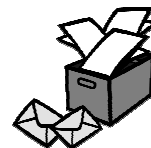

A Note from Fr. Tom

WEATHERIZATION GRANTS for people’s homes are available for residents of Putnam County who are already on HEAP and PIP. There are income eligibility requirements. For example, a person living alone who earns \$24,120 a year or less is eligible. For a family of four, the requirement is earnings of \$49,200 or less. MONSIGNOR CLEO SCHMENK passed away late last week at age 90. He was the assistant priest at St. Anthony in the 1950s, and was temporary administrator of the parish for about 1½ years during the illness of Father Finsel. Older parishioners remember him fondly. He was the pastor at Regina Coeli in Toledo when I was the associate pastor there from 1976 to 1979. I learned a great deal from him, especially concerning theology of ministry and the proper way of celebrating the Church’s liturgy. He began the permanent deacon and lay ministry training program for the Diocese of Toledo in the 1970s, and ran it for about 20 years. He was in demand as a speaker in other dioceses that were setting up such programs, even traveling as far as Wasilla, Alaska, the hometown of Sarah Palin. (No, she did not attend his talks.)

Monsignor Schmenk’s Mass of Christian Burial will be in Glandorf this Thursday at 11:00 a.m. May he live in peace in God’s Kingdom.

YEAR OF MATTHEW: The readings at Mass are arranged in a 3-year cycle. This year most of the Gospel readings are taken from St. Matthew. Ordinary Time gives us the opportunity to look at St. Matthew’s message slowly and carefully. Here are some points that are worth remembering:

- Matthew probably wrote for Jews who had become Christian. He frequently quotes the Old Testament to show that Jesus is the Messiah Whom the Old Testament had predicted.
- Matthew is very concerned about Jesus’ teaching on the kingdom of heaven. This kingdom entails justice, peace and joy here on earth. We come to the kingdom by obeying the will of the Father.
- Matthew is also concerned about the Church. He alone preserves Jesus’ words to Peter: “You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church.” Within the Church, Matthew is concerned for forgiveness, humility, and for outreach to the least ones, and to people who stray. Anyone in the Church can fall, even Peter. The Church is a mixture of saints and sinners until the Lord comes and does the final sorting. The Church is called to a worldwide mission.

So happy reading, and happy listening to the Gospel this summer and fall. I hope that Saint Matthew helps all of us to grow in our love of Jesus Christ and our obedience to Him. I also hope that he helps all of us to broaden our understanding of the Church and our mission in the world.
