**ASTOUNDING VERSES:** In 1820, 77-year-old Thomas Jefferson issued his own version of the Gospels. Jefferson was a deist and a rationalist. In other words, he believed in a God who created the universe but ever since has kept his distance from it. This God does not interact with creation, and does not involve himself in human affairs. If anything appeared unreasonable or supernatural, Jefferson removed it from his version of the Bible. As the housekeeper in Delphos used to say, if you're going to do that, you must have more crust than a loaf of French bread.

Some of the verses we read today probably did not "make the cut," because in them Jesus is claiming His own divinity. "No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows Father except the Son, and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal Him." Here Jesus is claiming not to be just another traveling teacher, of which there were plenty in His day. He is claiming a relationship with God that no one else has. He is claiming sonship with God, and is partially revealing the Trinity. If Jesus is Who He says He is, then His invitation to us makes the most profound difference in our lives: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." If Thomas Jefferson's Jesus said such a thing, it would be no more meaningful than some encouragement from one of our best friends. But if the Son of God Who is God Himself said it, then it means that He chooses to be the power that overcomes all the woes that life can throw at us. He even overcomes the woes that we stubbornly choose for ourselves.
