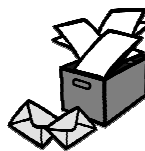

A Note from Fr. Tom

DOORBELLS: The doorbells at the rectory front door, and at the back door that faces the parking lot (under the portico) have been repaired. Once again you can be sure to get our attention when you are at the door.

EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT: We will continue to have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on First Friday after 8:00 Mass until noon; on Tuesday for about ½ hour after Mass; and on Saturday from 3:00 until the conclusion of the Rosary. (Confessions are also heard at these times on Tuesday and Saturday.)

What is the purpose of Exposition? It's a highly visible reminder that Jesus is truly present in the sign of bread, and that He is the heart and center of our Church life. It's a welcome to the celebration of the Mass (or sometimes an opportunity to say "thanks" for the Mass that we just celebrated.) It's an opportunity to pray for the needs of the parish, the diocese and the worldwide Church. (Some people say that parishes that have Exposition have more vocations to the priesthood and religious life. I don't know if any study backs up this claim). And it surely is an opportunity to lay our personal burdens before the Lord: sickness, financial troubles, problems with family relationships, etc.

An exception to our adoration schedule would be any Saturday on which there is an afternoon wedding. People socialize in church after a wedding; I think that's just natural, and I'm sure the Lord doesn't object to people sharing their joy. The sanctuary steps also get used as the photographer's setting for family pictures. With all this going on, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is not very feasible. So on the following Saturdays this summer and fall, we will not have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: July 29, August 12, 19 and 26, September 16, and October 7 and 21.

I would also like to thank people who refrain from conversing during Exposition, and who respect the need for silence of people who are praying. And thanks to Jean Kohls who shows up a little bit early for Saturday Mass, so that she can lead the Benediction hymn.
