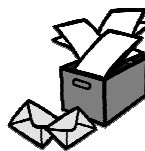

For your child to be able to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion, and Confirmation, they must be enrolled the year before in CCD class. Regular attendance is necessary for your child to be properly prepared to receive the sacraments. If your child was not baptized here at St. Anthony's, we will need a copy of your child's baptismal record. If you are not yet registered with our parish and would like to have your children participate in CCD, please register as soon as possible. All children age Kindergarten through eighth grade are welcome to attend.

A Note from Fr. Tom

FESTIVAL THANKS: Thanks to everyone who set up, cooked, cleaned, sorted, sold, kept records, prayed for good weather, or did any other task at our festival. A number of people from outside the parish remarked to me how people's cooperation is the key to a successful festival. And we surely get that cooperation from people of all different age groups and backgrounds. Our financial success is tremendous to be sure, but the level of cooperation among parishioners that we achieve is even more important.

HAIL HOLY QUEEN: As summer draws to an end, we celebrate the Assumption of Mary into heaven. Why is this feast important? It's one more indication of how important Mary is in the history of salvation. The Son of God took human flesh from her flesh, and so it was not proper for her to undergo the corruption of the grave. And so the Church's tradition has always been that upon her death, she was taken up into heaven, both body and soul. The Assumption is also a sign of hope for us. We can hope that where Mary has gone, we can hope to follow.

We will celebrate this holy day of obligation as follows: on Monday, August 14, Mass will be at 4:30 p.m. On Tuesday, August 15, Masses will be at 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
