"Why Do Catholics..."

Why do Catholics believe the Pope is infallible and what does that mean? In Math 16:18 and Luke 22:31-32 Jesus tells us the "powers of death (or hell)" will never prevail against the Church and He prays for Peter (as head of the church) that his faith may not fail. The pastor (Pope) of Christ's Church would never steer it into hell by teaching heresy. The Pope is infallible by a special grace that prevents him from leading Christ's Church in error in proclaiming by a **definitive act or doctrine pertaining to faith and morals** (CCC 891). For example, by Pope Pius XII, in defining the dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin in 1950 and also by papal canonizations of saints are deemed as infallible. If you see a Pope say "we define" or "I define," it is a signal (standard but not the only way) that he is making a definition and thus exercising the Church's gift of infallibility. Infallibility does not keep the Pope from giving his opinion or from personal sin.

A Note from Fr. Tom

500TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION: Bishop Thomas and Bishop Daniel Beaudoin, bishop of the Northwestern Ohio Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church will lead a joint Commemoration of the Reformation at St. Michael's in Findlay (the new church) at 3 p.m. on Sunday, September 10 at 3 p.m. Some of our own choir members will be in the joint choir. Admission is by ticket. I have four tickets to give away to anyone who is interested.

Some people have asked why this celebration is taking place. Are we saying the Lutheran/Catholic break was a good thing? Definitely not. We are praying over the pain of separation and division. Some people experience that pain right in their own marriage, if the spouses belong to two different households of faith. Yet at the same time, we are celebrating with hope, especially considering how far ecumenism has come in the last fifty years. At the Last Supper, Jesus prayed that all his followers might be one; the hope is that the joint commemoration will be a tiny step toward making that prayer take effect.

Ecumenism does not work by making compromises. It's not *The Art of the Deal*; it's not "if you give up belief A, we will start teaching belief B." Ecumenism is a quest to understand exactly what another church teaches, and where possible to come to a mutual understanding with the hope that someday by the grace of God, we will find our way to being one Church again.

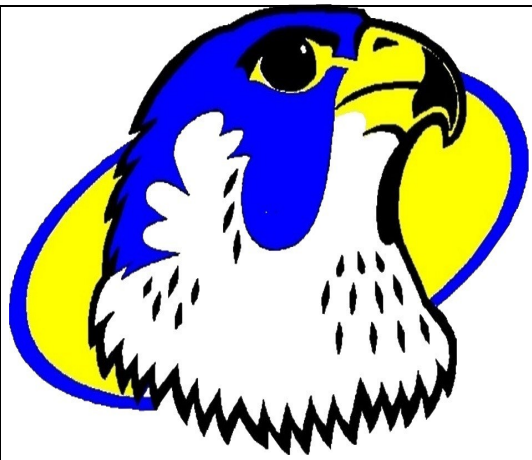
