"Why Do Catholics..."

Why do Catholic bibles have 73 books? The canon of Scripture for the Christian Church was determined with the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in the 4th Century by Catholic Bishops at the Councils at Carthage and Hippo. The New Testament has 27 and the Old Testament has 46. Some Jewish leaders rejected 7 of the Old Testament books because Hebrew versions could not be found. In 1529 Martin Luther chose to also reject them. However, nearly 400 years later, Hebrew copies of some of these books were found in the Dead Sea scrolls at Qumram. These books are Wisdon, Sirach, Judith, Baruch, Tobit, and 1 & 2 Maccabees. Three hundred quotes from them are found in the New Testament. The Septuagint, which these 7 books are called, was the translation used by Jesus and the writers of the New Testament. "A Minute in the Church" by Gus Lloyd


Don has been attending classes, writing papers, and participating in spiritual exercises for several years now, and we can all rejoice that the day of ordination is nearly here. What is a deacon's ministry? A deacon reaches out to people who might otherwise be neglected in the church, as his talents suggest and the needs of the individual parish demand. Because the deacon brings Christ to the least ones, he reads the Gospel at Mass. And because he knows the human needs in the community, he reads the petitions. He also is a regular minister of Holy Communion, baptizes and witnesses marriages.

Don will minister at the altar for the first time on Sunday, September 24 at 11:00 a.m.

HURRICANE HARVEY: We've all been following the story of the tragedy that is unfolding in Texas and Louisiana. A story on the radio on Monday said that 9 trillion gallons of water had fallen on Harris County (Houston), Texas. That's the amount of water that goes over Niagara Falls in 208 days. We don't know how many people have died, or how many have lost their homes, livelihoods, or possessions. And now the storm is aimed at Louisiana.

What can we do in Columbus Grove? First of all, we can pray. We can pray that the residents will be safe, and that they will not lose hope. We can pray for the police, firefighters, National Guard, and other emergency workers. And we can pray for those who have died, and for their family members. Second of all, we can give financial help. Bishop Thomas has asked us to take up a collection next weekend, September 9-10. We will forward your donation to Toledo Catholic Charities, who will then forward it in its entirety to Houston Catholic Charities. Several years ago, when there were severe floods in the southern part of our diocese, Catholic Charities from other dioceses sent money to us – and that included dioceses that are quite poor. Now it's our turn to help people get back on their feet.

RCIA: I drove past a Lutheran church in Toledo that was advertising their adult pre-Baptism class. Their signboard read: "Pre-Baptism Class – Because Some Questions Google Can't Answer." And that's why we have RCIA: because some questions are too deep for human reason. We believe that God has answered our questions in the person of Jesus Christ, His Son who became man, taught, healed, suffered, died and rose again. In RCIA, we investigate who Jesus is, and how He has answered our questions about life, death, right, wrong, our mission on earth and our mission in heaven. Come to the rectory on Thursday at 7 p.m. as we explore the Catholic Church's explanation of Jesus' answers. There is no obligation for coming and no class fee. Classes will continue on Thursdays until after Easter, with some breaks for holidays.
