

As a matter of fact it does, if you say the Lord's Prayer at least once a day. That phrase, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" is meant to sting sometimes. God is merciful, but in order to receive His mercy, we have to let Him change us, free us from anger, and let us see clearly how to serve Him today.
