A Note from Fr. Tom

CHURCH PAINTING REPORT: We met with our painting contractor, and set January 15 as the date we will start painting the interior of the church. The ceiling will remain white, except the arched ceiling in the sanctuary, which will be a very pale blue, with darker blue in the round insets of the windows. The walls will be light tan (not at all yellowish), with a darker shade of tan and some accents of maroon on the arches and pillars. The second graders didn't know what color maroon is; the best description I can give is the shade of red on the Cleveland Cavaliers' uniforms. I want to thank Bob and Bev Baxter, Connie Kruse, Jean Kohls, and Barb Schroeder (N. High St.) for their advice on colors.

Masses will be in the parish hall from early January until about the third week of March. After the New Year, we will need a crew to move church downstairs. We will need both people who can lift and carry, and also people who have the talent to make the hall beautiful. Watch further bulletins for details on the moving crew.

That means that many parish social activities will need to be moved or cancelled out of respect for the Blessed Sacrament. In situations where we must hold a social event in the hall, one of the deacons or I will move the Blessed Sacrament temporarily to the rectory living room. I will be speaking with the Knights of Columbus, Rosary-Altar Society, CLC, That Man is You and with our youth minister about the best way to provide for their gatherings.

In the event of a **funeral**, we will have to adapt, because we can't have food preparation on one side of the counter while Mass is taking place on the other side. We will have to have a funeral Mass at St. Anthony and borrow another hall for the lunch, or else borrow one of the neighboring churches for the Mass, and have the lunch back here.

Our contractor has offered to take \$2000-3000 off our bill if we **remove the pews and store them elsewhere**. I have been informed that it would not be a good idea to store them in the festival building, since it is not heated. Cold and humidity could cause some of the oak veneer to loosen from our pews. I already have one offer of a building with minimum heat in which we could store some of our pews. Are there a few more people who have such a building that we could borrow? If not, we will be better off leaving the pews in place and paying the contractor to work around them.

While the scaffolding is erected, we will be inspecting the upper-level leaded windows, as well the wiring for our chandeliers. It will be good to get as much work as possible done near the ceiling while we have the scaffolding. The painting contractor has agreed with our request to get this work done.

Painting the church will be inconvenient, and will require all of us to be flexible and willing to sacrifice, but I think the end result will be well worth whatever trouble we encounter.


ALL SAINTS and ALL SOULS: An important part of our Catholic belief is the <u>sacramental system</u>. This means that God's good creation can be an instrument through which God's grace reaches us. The rosary in your pocket, clouds of incense, church statues: they are all signs of God's goodness. The water of Baptism, the bread and wine that are consecrated at Mass, the oil of Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick and Holy Orders: they are on a higher order because they cause the spiritual change that they signify.

The Saints are likewise human instruments for God's grace to reach us. In their bodies they suffered for the Faith as martyrs, or they traveled all over the world in poor conditions to spread the Gospel, or they prayed with knees bent and hands uplifted. Their bodies became God's instruments to show the rest of us how to live our faith. And now they can and do pray for us before the throne of God. When we say "I believe in the Communion of Saints", we are professing our faith that the Church here on earth, the Church in heaven, and the Church in purgatory are all one Church who support and pray for one another, and who glorify God together.

**November 1, All Saints Day** is a holy day of obligation to celebrate this mystery. We will have Mass on Tuesday, October 31 at 4:30 pm. Masses on November 1 will be at 8:00 a.m. (with the school attending), and at 7:00 p.m.

**November 2 is All Souls Day.** The older I get, and the more people I know who have died, the more important this day becomes for me. Since it is not a holy day of obligation, we will have only one Mass at 8 a.m. Grades 4-8 will attend.

Our annual prayer service for those who have died in the last 12 months will take place **next Sunday, November 5 at 2 p.m.** This service will consist of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Vespers, a short homily, reading the names of those who have died, presentation of commemorative candles to their families, and Benediction. Quite a few parishioners come to this service who have not had a death in their family, but who believe that it is important to give prayer support to those who have had a death.
