We are grateful to Karl and Blanche Stechschulte who have been bringing Holy Communion to the residents of Hilty Home for <u>thirty-five years!</u> We are all very grateful to them for their outstanding dedication to this ministry. Karl and Blanche feel that it is time to let go of their place on the schedule. We would like to train someone else (or even a few somebodies) to replace them.

2. We are also grateful to the parishioner who has cared for the flowerbeds along our front walk. This work has made the outside of our church look beautiful and inviting. It has also provided a beautiful location for receiving lines after weddings.

HURRICANE COLLECTIONS: The collections for victims of hurricanes in Texas, Florida, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands from our diocese amounted to \$599,033.74. This is a truly outstanding amount, considering that it was taken up with only one week's notice, and that there were two collections almost back to back with no sign of "donor fatigue." Of this amount, our parish gave \$10,138.00 Thanks to all of you!

VOCATIONS AWARENESS WEEK: Nation-wide, the number of priests being ordained has risen slightly in recent years, although not enough to keep pace with priests' retirements and deaths. The good news is that the average age of the newly ordained is decreasing (which means we can hope they will serve longer.) The <u>really</u> good news is that more people report that they are encouraging young men to consider priesthood. Did you know that

- On the average, young men first consider priesthood at age 16. We must have above-average young men at St. Anthony, because I've had 12-year-olds tell me that they've considered it.
- 82% of the priests ordained in 2017 were encouraged to consider priesthood by 4 people or more. Invite, invite, invite!
- Pray, pray, pray! Before entering the seminary, 69% of young men regularly prayed the Rosary, and 75% regularly attended Eucharistic adoration. We have adoration at St. Anthony every Tuesday after Mass, on Saturdays when there is no wedding from 3:00 until about 4:20, and on First Fridays from 9:00 to noon. Our teachers are now scheduling First Friday adoration for their classes.

CG CONNECTION: A few weeks ago, Deacon Don Siefker, Darren Langhals and I met with Coach Andy Schaffer at the newly-opened CG Connect to learn about the program. It's located above the Pizzeria, and is well decorated and furnished. I went to the meeting with a skeptical attitude, but came away believing that this is a positive development for our community. Coach Schaffer assured us that the program of CG Connect is simply to provide a safe gathering place for youth on nights when there is a varsity game. Junior-high students are welcome before games, and senior-high students afterward.

There is no effort to recruit teens for any one church ("sheep-stealing" is what priests and ministers call it.) There is encouragement for teens to take part in the life of their family's church. Information about a mid-week teen Bible study is posted; if your teen attends the Bible study be sure to ask him or her about its content. I think the best thing we can do for young people and for Saint Anthony is to help provide food, and especially to have Catholic adults volunteering as chaperones.




