Information the Public Should Know About Planned Parenthood ~ Planned Parenthood 2015 annual report shows increases in abortion numbers and taxpayer funding in 2015, alongside decreases in contraception, breast exams and overall patient numbers. Planned Parenthood continued to maintain its status as the largest abortion provider in the United States (and again, increased its market share of that industry). The abortion group performed **328,348** abortions on unborn babies, **4,349** more than the previous year, according to the report. At the same time, it saw 2.4 million patients, about 100,000 fewer than the previous year and about 500,000 fewer than five years ago. Contraception services, which the abortion chain touts as its primary service, also dropped from 2.94 million to 2.8 million during the past two years. Meanwhile, the abortion chain received more taxpayer funding. The report shows Planned Parenthood receiving **\$554.6 million**, up from **\$553.7 million** the previous year. This pattern is consistent with its annual reports from the past several years. Abortions and taxpayer funding keep going up, while patient numbers and other services go down. Recent polls also indicate Americans support the defunding efforts. New polling found 56 percent of Americans in battleground states want Planned Parenthood defunded.

A Note from Fr. Tom

THANKSGIVING CELEBRATIONS: Our first celebration of Thanksgiving will be at the last children's Mass before the big day: **this Friday, November 17 at 8 a.m.** It is the feast of St. Elizabeth of Hungary, who gave away nearly everything she had in order to help the poor. That makes it an appropriate day to help the poor, as we always do with our food collection for the Lord's Pantry.

The second celebration of Thanksgiving will be on Thanksgiving morning, **Thursday, November 23 at 9 a.m.** (Notice the extra hour to sleep in.) It's always one of our biggest non-holy-day Masses. The collection of non-perishable food items will continue at that Mass. We will also have a cash collection for the Lord's Pantry at that Mass. Depending on the amount of the collection, and on the weight of the food we donate, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus will give an additional donation, up to \$300 to the Lord's Pantry.

I am sorry, but there will not be an ecumenical Thanksgiving service this year. Each of the other ministers has out-of-town commitments, and I am not prepared to organize, and preach at the service all by myself.

THANKS TO ALL who participated in the All Souls Vesper service for the parishioners who died in the last twelve months. More than 100 people were in church, both family members and those who came to offer prayer support to these families. We extend special thanks to the people who organized the service.

FEATHER PARTY: Our annual feather party will take place next Sunday, November 19 between Masses. I think it's one of the most fun occasions of our entire parish year. Breakfast by the Knights of Columbus, a bake sale by the Rosary-Altar Society, ham and turkey raffles, and a raffle for the kids plus chances to win a golf cart: who could ask for anything more? Don't miss it!

Why is this called a feather party? Because back in your great-grandfather's day, they used to give away live birds. Ask me sometime, and I'll tell you a wild story about the time my grandfather came home from the parish feather party with a live turkey under his arm.

CATHOLIC CHURCH AND SACRAMENTS: This is part 3 of a series on the differences that separate Catholics from Protestants. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* begins the discussion of sacraments by talking about the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. This began the "age of the Church", in which Christ makes present His work of salvation. He makes His saving work present through the Church's liturgy (its public worship), and He will continue doing this until He comes again in glory.

All of God's work is a blessing: the fruitfulness of the earth, the birth of Isaac to Abraham and Sarah, the escape from Egypt and gift of the Promised Land, the commandments, the mysterious presence of God in the Temple, and the return of a small remnant of people after the purifying exile in Babylon.

God continues to bless the world in the death and resurrection of His Son. This is not just an event of past history; it is an event that the Church makes present over and over again. Jesus' saving act cannot be something over and done with because He has destroyed death. Everything that Jesus said or did participates in His Father's eternity. He remains with us in the events that His Church carries out with faith. Jesus has entrusted His own power of sanctifying to the Church.

When we celebrate sacraments, we always celebrate with human words and material from God's good creation: life-giving water, bread, wine, and oil. The material thing signifies what God is doing; for example, just as God gives natural life through water, so He gives the life of the Trinity through the waters of baptism. Just as the bread in the kitchen feeds our bodies, so Jesus Himself is present to feed us in the Bread of Life. All this presumes the <u>faith</u> of the one receiving, that is, a basic openness to God's gift. It also presumes that the celebrant carries out the rite not by improvising, but by faithfully following the will of Christ as the Church has discerned it.

Sacraments are important to some of our Protestant brothers and sisters. Others see them as a reminder of God's presence, or a human commemoration of something that happened long ago. Protestants are highly centered on God's Word in the Bible. We Catholics needed a strong reminder from them to pay more attention to the Bible, and to explain more of it from the pulpit. Our gift to Protestants is a reminder that in the risen Jesus, God makes His saving acts real and present in the Church's celebration of the sacraments.

For a more in-depth study, see paragraphs 1066 to 1209 of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. If you are pressed for time, you can find brief summaries in paragraphs 1110-1112, 1131-1134, and 1187 to 1199.

This Week's LIFE Skill : Patience

"The patient man shows much good sense, but the quick tempered man displays folly at its height."

Proverbs 14: 29
