"Why do Catholics....."

Why do Catholics pray to Mary and the Saints? We do not worship or adore Mary and the Saints as that is only properly due to God. We honor, respect and venerate them showing them reverence for the humble and holy lives they led. All persons in heaven are saints, but the Church has declared publicly those as Saints who have been known, proven, recognized and honored for their holiness. This is not a quick or simple process but includes specific steps: ervant of God (the cause is open for consideration), Venerable (determination they have lived a life of virtue), Blessed (one miracle verified), and Saint (second miracle verified). We pray to them, asking for their intercession on behalf of ourselves or someone else, just as we ask each other to pray for us or a special intention and as persons asked Jesus in the bible for a favor on behalf of others. Certain saints are given feast days on the calendar.

RETIRED RELIGIOUS COLLECTION: The annual collection for retired Sisters and male religious deserves our consideration. When we adults were in grade school, tuition was a token amount. In my school, it was \$5 for one child, \$8 for two, and \$10 maximum for a family. Those were rates for the whole year. That extremely low tuition was possible because the Sisters received only a token salary, something like \$35 a month. From this amount they were supposed to run their household, pay tuition for their degrees, and help pay for the retired Sisters of their day, who were much fewer in number than the retirees of today. Nothing was put aside for the retirement of the then-active Sisters. It was always assumed that there would be enough active Sisters to pay for the retirees, but the fact of the matter is that the ratio of active Sisters to retirees has become very low. And of course it was impossible to foresee today's increases in health care costs. It is really important to help today with the retirement of the Sisters who educated us when we were young.

DO WE HAVE TO GO TO MASS TWICE? Yes. Sunday is the Lord's Day no matter if it falls conveniently or inconveniently. So we will observe the Fourth Sunday of Advent at the Saturday evening Mass on December 23, and then on the morning of the 24th at 8:30 and 11:00 am. Then we will observe the second most important day of the Church year, remembering the incredible gift of God coming in our human flesh, born of Mary. Masses on the evening of the 24th will be Christmas Masses (4:00, 6:00 and 10:00). On Christmas Day itself, we will have a Mass at 9 a.m.


Mass on the Lord's Day may be our most ancient tradition. Generally, the most ancient traditions are the ones that are most basic, and least likely to be dispensed from. The tradition is mentioned in Acts 20:7, 1st Corinthians 16:2, and Revelation 1:10. I found a whole list of quotes from other first and second-century writers who stressed the importance of Sunday (I'll e-mail it to anyone who is interested.) The most notable is from a 1st-century anonymous manual of Christian life called the *Teaching of the Twelve Apostles*, sometimes known by the Greek name *The Didache:* "On the Lord's Day come together and break bread. And give thanks (offer the Eucharist), after confessing your sins that your sacrifice may be pure."

Can the pastor give a dispensation? I can't give group dispensations, no matter the cause. Only the Bishop can dispense a group. And neither the Bishop nor I can give dispensations just for someone's convenience. Someone jokingly asked if he could come to one Mass and put both envelopes in the basket. Even though we love collection envelopes and are most grateful for people's generosity, that just doesn't cut it. So next weekend we will gather twice to listen to the Lord speak to us, and to celebrate the sacrifice that Jesus offered for us – and continues to offer.

Father Robert DeSloover, retired pastor of Miller City and New Cleveland, will be with us to offer two of those Masses: 11 a.m. for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and 6:00 p.m. for Christmas.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: That first-century quote from an anonymous writer should be repeated: "And give thanks after confessing your <u>sins</u> that your sacrifice may be pure." A good number of parishioners have already celebrated the sacrament, either here at our parish, or in a neighboring parish. There are four Penance Services remaining: Sunday (today) at St. Charles at 3 p.m., Monday at Ottawa at 4 and 7 p.m., and here in our own parish on Tuesday at 7 p.m.

In addition, there will be Confessions on Wednesday from 7 to 8 p.m., on Friday from 10 to 11 a.m., and on Saturday from 2 to 4 p.m. If none of these fit your schedule, please call for an appointment.
