Scripture gives us instructions: *Matt20:26-28* tells us to serve others as Christ came to serve us including giving His life as a ransom for all; *Jas2:14-17* tells us to help those less fortunate & in need not just by good thoughts or words but by action, for **if good deeds do not go with our faith** then it is dead. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the Catholic Church applies the gospel of Jesus Christ to society. This rests on the profound respect for each person's dignity for the basic human rights: to life and bodily integrity, to respect for one's person and a good reputation, to food, shelter and clothing. Other rights include economic, political, religious, social, cultural, and others. Every right has a corresponding duty for others to respect, foster and fulfill the right and also a duty to his or her own rights. The book we are using for RCIA, "This Is Our Faith" along with the CCC have much more information on social justice.

Plenary Indulgence Available – March for Life ~ By special grant of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, Cardinal Mauro Piacenza, the Major Penitentiary of the Catholic Church, has informed the Bishops of the United States that a plenary indulgence can be obtained by the Christian faithful by taking part in the sacred celebrations of the 2018 March for Life (18-19 January 2018). Those that are unable to attend or participate in the March for Life due to age, sickness, or other grave reason, may also obtain the plenary Indulgence, provided that they have the disposition of detachment from any kind of sin and have the intention of fulfilling, as soon as they are able, the three customary conditions of the Indulgence if they spiritually unite themselves to the sacred events of the March for Life, and also having offered prayers and their sufferings or the ailments of their own life to the merciful God." The three customary conditions for receiving the plenary indulgence include: sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayers for the intentions of Pope Francis.

A Note from Fr. Tom

MARCH FOR LIFE – PLENARY INDULGENCE: Once again, the March for Life will take place in Washington DC on January 18-19. There will be many marchers, way more than the major news media estimate. I've watched parts of it on EWTN; it's inspiring to know that so many people (and young ones too!) are standing up for life.


If you want to watch, the opening Mass of the Prayer Vigil for Life will be shown on EWTN at 5:30 pm on Thursday, January 18. The closing Mass will be at 7:30 am on Friday, January 19; it will be re-broadcasted that same day at 6:30 pm. The March itself will be broadcasted in its entirety from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm.

Pope Francis is granting a plenary indulgence to all those who take part in the March and/or the all-night prayer vigil. People who are unable to attend or participate in the March for Life due to age, sickness, or other grave reason, may also obtain the plenary indulgence, provided that they have the disposition of detachment from any kind of sin if they spiritually unite themselves to the sacred events of the March for Life, and also offered prayers and their sufferings to the merciful God. Those who wish to gain the indulgence must also fulfill the usual conditions: prayers for the intention of Pope Francis, and confession and Holy Communion as soon afterward as is reasonably possible.

NEW ULTRASOUND FOR HEARTBEAT OF LIMA: The ultrasound machine that we helped to buy for Heartbeat of Lima 6½ years ago is worn out with use. That's not bad news; that's good news! Think of all the lives that were saved! The four Knights of Columbus Councils of Putnam County, plus the Delphos and Lima Councils, have committed themselves to buying a new ultrasound machine. We will take up a second collection at Masses in two weeks, January 20-21. If there is a shortfall in the amount collected, our local Council will make up the difference. If we go over our goal, the excess money will be used for supplies for the machine.

GETTING READY TO PAINT: This Friday, January 12 at 9:30 a.m., we will start to set up the parish hall for Masses while the church is being painted. I've identified 19 tasks that need to be done. Some of them involve heavy lifting; some of them are tedious; some of them can be done quickly; some of them involve a sense of how to make things look nice. But it all needs to be done. That day the school has a hot lunch; I've arranged for the workers to enjoy the hot lunch also, as guests of the parish. We will finish arrangements on Monday the 15th, starting at 9:30 a.m. The big jobs will be to set up 200-250 folding chairs, and bring the hymnals and missalettes downstairs.
