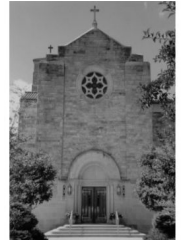

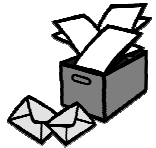

"Why do Catholics....."

Why do Catholics believe in the Sacrament of the Eucharist? *"In all truth I tell you if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink His blood, you have no life in you. Anyone who does eat My flesh and drink My blood has eternal life, and I shall raise that person up on the last day." John 6:53-54.* This was prefigured by Melchizedek offering bread and wine in Gn 14:18, at each Passover celebration with unleavened bread and the cup of blessing commemorating the Exodus, and God's gift of manna in the desert. Jesus established this sacrament at the Last Supper saying "Take and eat. This is My Body, which will be broken for you. Do this in memory of Me", then said "Take and drink. This is the Cup of My Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be shed for you. Do this in memory of Me." He commanded His apostles to celebrate Eucharist until His final return not as a symbol, but as from a Hebrew word to actually gnaw or chew Christ's flesh.

The “Fetus” ~ For many years, their most significant and basic argument has been that the so-called fetus is not a human life. They also claim that the question of when human life begins is uncertain and a religious issue.

However, medical textbooks and scientific reference works consistently agree that life begins at conception, when a genetically distinct individual is brought into existence. Some of the world's most prominent scientists and physicians testified to a U.S. Senate committee that human life begins at conception. At these same hearings, pro-abortionists, though invited to do so, failed to produce even a single expert witness who would testify that life begins at any point other than conception.

From the moment of conception, the unborn fetus is not simple, but very complex. The newly fertilized egg contains a staggering amount of genetic information, sufficient to control the individual's growth and development for an entire lifetime. It is scientifically inaccurate and untrue to say a fetus is not a human being simply because he or she is at an earlier stage of development than an infant.

The mother and the unborn child are two separate individuals and half the time, they are not even the same sex! The child has its own DNA, fingerprints and blood type, distinct from the mother's.

A Note from Fr. Tom

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK: When my great-grandfather Extejt came to this country in the 1870s, his first job was to pave the dirt streets in downtown Toledo with bricks, and to lay trolley tracks. He was paid 50¢ a day for a 12-hour day. He received six half-dollars from the paymaster at the end of the workday on Saturday. He said that he had never held so much money in his hands in his entire life. Before emigrating, he had been a farm worker on a nobleman's estate, and was paid even less than that. From the very beginning he put some of that \$3 aside to help his parish (St. Anthony, would you believe?) build a Catholic school. Within the next twenty years, my other great-grandparents came to Toledo, and they made a similar commitment.

Some of my great-grandparents never learned how to read or write. My grandparents went to Catholic grade school for six years, and then had to get jobs. Mom and Dad went to Catholic high school during the Depression, when tuition dollars were very hard to come by. They put their five kids through Catholic colleges, admittedly before the cost of tuition went sky-high. It all started with bricks that have been paved over with blacktop somewhere in downtown Toledo.

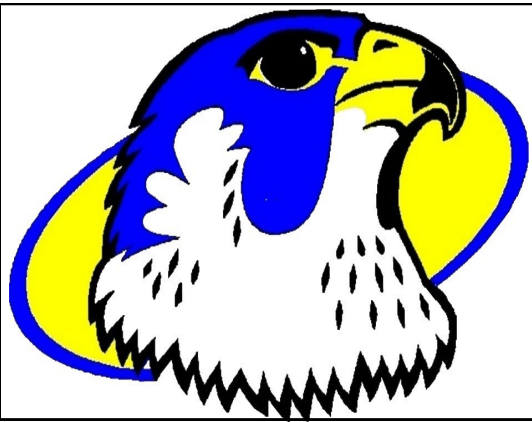
My great-grandparents came to the United States so that their kids could have an education. They had a passion for Catholic education, because those were the schools where Catholic immigrant children would be respected and their faith wouldn't be misrepresented or ridiculed. And they knew that nothing was more important than their faith, and handing it on to their children.

If they could only see “our” St. Anthony School, they would be pleased. (Since we are one body of Christ, they may well be looking down on it and smiling.) They would recognize dedicated teachers and staff, children who are eager to learn, and above all, a community of faith that strives to know Jesus Christ better each day.

Our children will be reading and doing other parts at the 11:00 a.m. Mass today. There will be a program in the gym after Mass featuring all our kids, and an open house in all the classrooms, with the teachers present to greet you. Come and enjoy.

NEXT FRIDAY: Catholic Schools Week will end on Friday, February 2 on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. The Child Jesus is presented in the Temple in accordance with God's Law, and there Simeon sees clearly that the Child is the Lord of the Temple. He proclaims that Jesus is “a light of revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of God's people Israel.” Since we are Christ-centered, and since we are about showing the light of Christ to the world, what a fitting end to Catholic Schools Week! Our school will celebrate this feast jointly with SS. Peter and Paul and St. Mary's Catholic Schools. This year, Ottawa is hosting the Mass at 10:00 a.m., with activities and lunch to follow. Please join us for the celebration.
