"Why do Catholics....."

Why do Catholics use ashes on forehead on Ash Wednesday? Biblical Response: Over forty passages in the Bible associate ashes with mourning and grief. In the Old Testament people used ashes as a sign of repentance. They would sit in ashes, roll around in them, sprinkle them upon their heads, or even mingle them with their food and drink as an outward sign of their inward posture of repentance. Ash Wednesday begins Lent, a time when we stop and assess how we're doing in our walk with God. Lent helps us identify spiritual areas in which we can grow and sinful areas that we need to avoid. To repent, put simply, means to turn away from sin and turn toward God. We use ashes as an outward expression of our need to begin again. Traditional Response: Ashes are a sign of physical death, as in 'ashes to ashes, dust to dust'. We began as dust (a joyless and lifeless existence), and our bodies will return to dust until we are raised up by Christ. By receiving ashes and keeping them on, we publicly proclaim our intent to die to our worldly desires and live even more in Christ's image, which we focus on during the season of 'rebirth' that is Lent (a Latin term for 'Spring'). Historical Response: For over twelve hundred years on the dies cinerum (day of ashes) faithful followers have approached the altar and received ashes upon their foreheads. These ashes are made from the burnt palm fronds that were blessed on the Palm Sunday of the previous year. The ashes are sprinkled with holy water. Ashes are applied to believers' foreheads in the shape of the cross. Symbolic Response: God formed Adam out of the 'dust' of the earth, Genesis 2:7. Jesus healed the blind man with clay (earth and spit), John 9:6. We mark ourselves with ashes as a 'new beginning' at the onset of Lent, allowing the life of Jesus Christ to make us whole and new again. Most Basic Response: I'm a sinner. I don't always love God as strongly as I could or as directly as I should. Ash Wednesday reminds me that it is only through God that I have life; He gave it to me. Ash Wednesday also begins my preparation for Holy Week and the Passion and Resurrection of my Lord, Jesus, without Whom I have no life here and no chance at eternal life in Heaven. This is just a great opportunity for me to get better. God forgives. He loves. He gives this sinner a second chance. ASH WEDNESDAY: One Christmas when I was newly ordained and serving under Bishop Ottenweller in Delphos, he reminisced about Christmas when he was newly ordained, and how Monsignor Reineck (pastor from 1940 to 1962) once remarked on December 26, "Well, that takes care of Christmas. Now, if we could just get Lent and Holy Week over with right away, we'd be in great shape."

I'd like to disagree with this wise elder of earlier days. I enjoyed the low-key celebrations of January and early February. But now it's time for a wake-up call, which the Church will provide this Wednesday. Masses will be at 8:00 a.m. (whole school attending) and 7:00 p.m. The ashes are a mark of our willingness to walk with Jesus through these 40 days, to die to sin in union with His death, and then to rise with Him at Easter. We are welcoming brother and sister Christians from the neighboring churches to celebrate the beginning of Lent with us. We will then be welcomed at their churches for a Wednesday Lenten prayer service and lunch. See the schedule elsewhere in the bulletin.

A PECULIAR CALENDAR: This year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day, much to the chagrin, no doubt, of the Hallmark Card and Schrafft's Candy people. Maybe our reading from St. Paul is the key to understanding this collision on the calendar. Saint Paul says that God "made him who did not know sin, to be sin, so that we might become the very holiness of God." So this year on February 14, we aren't celebrating human romance or emotions. We are celebrating God's boundless love for sinners, His sacrifice for us as undeserving as we are, and His desire to raise us up to His holiness and happiness. Maybe Mardi Gras on February 13 would be a better day for romance and a candle-light dinner?

Did you notice that this year, Easter Sunday falls on April Fools' Day? What a fool Jesus' resurrection made out of Satan! Satan thought he had the perfect plan to kill Life. Instead death got broken forever, and we will enjoy the life and freedom that Satan plotted to deprive us of.


I also noticed that Ascension Day and Mothers Day both fall on May 13. It will take me at least until May to figure out that coincidence.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: Last year's schedule worked so well that we'll repeat it this year. The grade school will have Stations of the Cross each Friday of Lent at 1 p.m., starting this week. Adults are welcome. The children's Stations booklets are geared for children, but without becoming childish. Adults can spiritually benefit from this children's service.

There will also be Stations for adults at 7 p.m. on Friday (with Benediction). Last year about 50 people came each week. You are welcome to join them.

RCIA NEWS: Three people have been faithfully preparing for the sacraments at the Easter Vigil. We will specially pray for them at the 11:00 Mass next Sunday, February 18, and send them forth to a prayer service at Findlay that afternoon, where the Bishop's delegate will welcome them to candidacy for the sacraments. We will further pray for them at the Scrutinies (March 4, 11 and 18). We will be using special pre-Baptismal readings those days, with Gospel readings about the woman at the well, the healing of the blind man, and the resurrection of Lazarus.
