"Why do Catholics....."

Why do Catholics have Lenten practices? Lent is the 40 days before Easter in which Catholics pray, fast, contemplate, and engage in acts of spiritual self-discipline. Catholics do these things because Easter, which celebrates the Resurrection of Christ, is the greatest holy day of the Christian year (even above Christmas) and Catholics have recognized that it is appropriate to prepare for such a holy day by engaging in such disciplines. Lent lasts "40" days which is the traditional number of judgment and spiritual testing in the Bible (Gn 7:4, Ex 24:18, 34:28, Nm 13:25, 14:33, Jon 3:4). Lent bears particular relationship to the 40 days Christ spent fasting in the desert before entering into his public ministry (Mt 4:1-11). Catholics imitate Christ by Fasting as a biblical discipline found in both the Old and the New Testament. Christ expected His disciples to fast (Mt 9:14-15) and issued instructions for how they should do so (Mt 6:16-18). Catholics follow this pattern by holding a partial fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence from certain foods is also a biblical discipline. In Daniel 10:2-3 we read, "In those days I, Daniel, was mourning for three weeks. I ate no delicacies, no meat or wine entered my mouth, nor did I anoint myself at all, for the full three weeks." Catholics use a practice similar to Daniel's when, as a way of commemorating Christ's Crucifixion on a Friday, they abstain from eating meat on that day of the week during Lent. The only kind of flesh they eat on Friday is fish, which is a symbol of Christ spending 40 days in spiritual discipline before the celebration of Christ's triumph over sin and death.




WELCOME, FATHER MIKE SERGI: Our parish mission with Father Mike Sergi begins today. His message will help us get Lent off on the right foot. Why is a community important? How do I pray, and why should I? My sins aren't all that much – are they? How can I be reconciled to God and to the people I have hurt? How is the Blessed Virgin Mary part of my life, and how is she a role model for me? Father Mike will introduce himself at all the Masses this weekend. Please consider his message your invitation to take part in the parish mission.

"REPENT AND BELIEVE": Saint Mark gives us no details about the temptations Jesus faced during his forty-day fast. We only hear that "He was among the wild beasts." The desert is a place where life hangs by a thread, where there is no physical comfort, and no human being to share your fears and stresses with. However, angels are present to minister to Him. And so He is able to spend this time deepening His relationship with God. Finally He returns to civilization with a message: "This is the time of fulfillment" – everything Israel awaited for centuries is happening now. "The Kingdom of God is at hand" – God is now showing that He is the true ruler of this world. And finally, Jesus calls us to "repent and believe in the gospel." He wants us to realize that He is bearing the best news possible, and our future depends on accepting it, rather than accepting the world's news about money, power and prestige. To be ready for Easter, you and I have to ask ourselves which good news we have accepted. That's what we do during Lent.

GOOD NEWS FOR CHILDREN... and BAD NEWS: The good news is from the Gerber Company. Ever since 2010, Gerber has held an annual photo contest to select the Gerber Baby. Besides getting your picture on all those little jars, you get \$50,000 in cash and other great rewards. This year's Gerber Baby is Lucas Warren, who is 18 months old and from Georgia. He has a smile that could light up 5 or 6 rooms. In his little bow tie he is, as we used to say, as cute as Christmas. Oh, and by the way, he has Down Syndrome. Some people might foresee a life of hardship for Lucas, and say that he will be a non-contributing burden to society, and that we would all be better off if his life had never started. But Lucas' message to the world seems to be "Lighten up, laugh and love! That's how I face life. You should try it too!" So deep thanks to the Gerber Company for giving a pro-life message to an increasingly anti-life world, a world that wants to pretend away people who aren't perfect – or even do much worse to them. Every baby who reads this bulletin should tell Mom to stock up the pantry with little pictures of Baby Lucas.

The bad news comes from China. In some provinces, Christian churches are being forced to post large signs saying "CHILDREN NOT ADMITTED." The Chinese make casinos and X-rated movie houses post the same sign. I'm sure the strategy is to make Christianity go extinct in China in a generation or two. Meanwhile, they hold talks with the Vatican on how to properly appoint bishops in accord with Chinese law. How hypocritical. Their government probably understands how lifeless a parish would be with no children.


