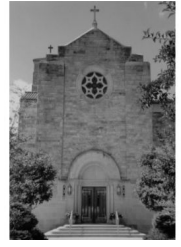

Renee Lareau, Sr. writer at the University of Notre Dame, has some good ideas to consider for Lent: **1.** Commit to read the Sunday scriptures before Mass. **2.** One hour of Adoration or at least silent meditation each week. **3.** Pick one way you spend your money and give it to a charity. **4.** Letter writing, acts of kindness, or phone calls to the important people in your life. **5.** Participate in one extra Mass per week. **6.** Attend Stations of the Cross and when not able to attend, view online (ex: Busted Halo has Virtual Stations of the Cross). **7.** Volunteer. **8.** Donate physically or financially to areas supporting the Dignity of Human Life. **9.** Pray for others throughout the day. **10.** Read scripture & other spiritual books. **11.** Sacrament of Reconciliation. **12.** Fast from: anger, worry, pessimism, hurting words, complaints, bitterness, selfishness, grudges...and replace with love and kindness.

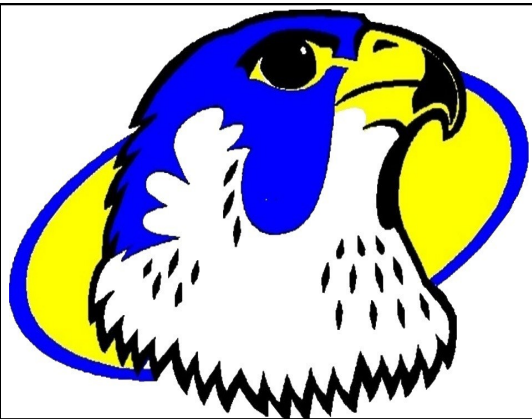
A Note from Fr. Tom

BACK IN CHURCH: Tuesday morning Mass was our last Mass in the parish hall. That evening we moved back into our church for the mission service. Thanks to the great moving crew we had to make the work go quickly. Thanks also to our maintenance staff for the fresh floor-waxing job in church. Thanks also to the parishioners who restored the wooden crosses that provide "background" for each of the Stations. One gentleman bought the materials; another actually made the crosses. As you know, maintaining a house or a public building is a never-ending process. So what is next? We will be replacing our sound system soon (cost \$8900), and doing some re-wiring to make the balky chandeliers in the back of church give steady light (cost about \$3200). We try to repair part of our parking lot and driveway each year; that cost varies. We will also have to repair some of our leaded glass windows (cost unknown). The lead strips expand and contract as the outside temperature changes, which stretches the solder joints out of shape. The window begins to bow inward. If nothing is done, pieces of glass fall out, and the repair bill increases many times.

SPIRITUAL RENOVATIONS: Building repairs are important; tending to the spiritual life of the parish, much more so. We are grateful to Fr. Mike Sergi, CSSR who preached our parish mission last week, and helped us to see why the life of a parish needs to reflect the life of the First Community, the community that is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In the light of this teaching, he helped us to understand prayer, the real effects of sin, and Mary as a model of how to live the life of the Trinity. We took up a collection on the last night of the mission to help the Redemptorist preaching ministry to continue. If you want to help, but weren't in church, or weren't prepared to give last Thursday, you can put your offering in a plain white envelope and mark it "Parish Mission Offering." We will forward it to the Redemptorists at St. Gerard's.

TRANSFIGURATION: On the Second Sunday of Lent, we traditionally read the Gospel account of Jesus' transfiguration. Jesus has shocked His disciples – really shaken their faith – by telling them that the Son of Man must suffer, die and rise again. On the way to Jerusalem, in order to strengthen their faith, He reveals who He really is. He isn't just another wandering teacher; there were plenty of those back then. He shines with the radiance of God Himself; Moses and Elijah appear to show that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law and Prophets; they hear the Father's voice saying "This is my beloved Son; listen to Him." May our Lent – may the rest of our lives be a journey we undertake with Jesus in spite of any troubles, in the firm hope that Resurrection is at the end of the road.
