"Why do Catholics......"

Why do Catholics have Eucharistic Adoration and what is it? Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper and commanded us to "Do this in memory of me." He is really present in the Eucharist. The Holy Eucharist is not some 'thing'. It is some 'one'. It is Jesus, our Lord and our God. When we look at the cross, we know how much Jesus loved us. When we look at the Eucharist, we know how much Jesus loves us <u>now</u>. This is why we should visit our friend, Jesus, in the Blessed Sacrament, to return His love for us and to draw spiritual strength and nourishment and encouragement from that love. The Eucharist is the principal expression of our faith, and all other devotions spring forth from it. Adoration of our Lord in the Eucharist causes more frequent and more intense participation in the Mass and we find it is an aid to have a visible, tangible sign of Christ's presence. Jesus waits for us in this sacrament of love. Let us be generous with our time in going to meet Him in adoration. One of the best aspects of Eucharistic adoration is this: how you spend your time with Jesus is entirely up to you. We are there to visit with our friend, Jesus. Talk with Him. Tell Him your problems, your needs or your concerns and joys. Pray the Rosary or other prayers or spiritual readings. Then listen to what Jesus has to tell us.

A Note from Fr. Tom

GOOD NEWS! Our new sound system in church will be installed starting after the 11:00 a.m. Mass today and continuing through Monday, March 12. Cost is about \$9400. It is identical to the system at St. Aloysius in Bowling Green, a building which is almost the same as ours in shape. Some of our members went to St. Aloysius, and found it a highly effective system. Because of the installation, Mass on Monday morning will be in the rectory dining room at 8:00 a.m.

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL: Twenty years from now, who will celebrate Mass at St. Anthony? Who will visit the classrooms? Who will minister in the nursing homes? If you donate to the Annual Catholic Appeal this year, you are helping to insure that a young man is being educated to serve this parish as its priest in 2038. You are also providing for a great number of other ministries that one parish cannot undertake on its own.

PARDON AND PEACE: In the words of forgiveness in Confession, the priest prays "May the Lord grant you pardon and peace." And who among us doesn't need pardon and peace? In Confession, we encounter Christ Who heals our sins. A large number of parishioners have already availed themselves of this meeting with the forgiving Lord during Lent. We had very well attended Penance Services first, during the Parish Mission (five priests heard for an hour) and then last Sunday for the Confirmation class, their parents and sponsors (3 priests heard for over an hour). Then last Tuesday we had a medium-sized service for grades 2 to 6 (3 priests heard for 45 minutes). A number of people remarked that they felt like the Lord had lifted a heavy burden from their souls. If you weren't among their number, there still are chances, with Penance Services at some of our neighboring churches, and extra Confession times here at St. Anthony. There is a schedule on page 4 of this bulletin.

THE IMPORTANCE OF FATHERS: How many times do commercials and films show the father of a family as an amiable dunce who needs to be straightened out by his smart kids who understand the 21st century? We've been hearing just the opposite at "That Man Is You" for almost four semesters now. The interest that a father shows in his spouse and kids, the example he gives them, and his conversations with them are vital for the children's future happiness. They are especially vital for the children's future religious commitment. If children see their father as the family's religious leader, they are more likely to have a strong religious commitment themselves. We've seen it in stories of the saints, especially St. Joseph, and we've found it in statistical studies done by reputable social scientists. I've heard more of it as bereaved families told me stories about their father or grandfather. Dads, this parish, this Catholic Church needs you! Thank you for exercising your gifts for the spiritual well-being, and the spiritual future of your spouse and children.

CONSCIENCE PROTECTION ACT: Congress needs to hear from us! Health care providers and trainees, churches, and others are being forced to participate in abortion or provide coverage for it in their health care plans. Federal conscience laws prohibit such coercion, but these laws continue to be violated, mostly because they don't provide victims with the ability to defend their rights in court. In the next week, Congress will decide whether to improve enforcement of these laws by enacting the Conscience Protection Act. No one should be forced to participate in abortion. Bishop Thomas asks us to tell our representatives today at humanlifeaction.org!

JESUS, THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD: We continue our special pre-Baptismal Lenten readings with the story of Jesus' encounter with the man born blind. When the man regains his physical eyesight, he also finds the light of faith. He becomes able to confess Jesus as Son of Man and to worship Him. Meanwhile the Pharisees, who think they can see perfectly well, are plunging farther into the darkness. They see the man who was blind as a traitor who should be thrown out of the synagogue. They see Jesus as a law-breaker who heals on the Sabbath, and who needs to be done away with.

How is your spiritual eyesight changing during Lent? Have you used prayer, fasting and works of mercy to come to know Jesus better, and to see Him at work in your family, your church, or your larger community? And in your prayer, please remember our candidates for the Sacraments, that the Lord may sharpen their spiritual vision as the Easter Vigil approaches.

Getting Started on the Northwest Ohio Scholarship Fund Application Process

Do you qualify for an NOSF scholarship?

There are several requirements that must be met to qualify for tuition assistance:

- Must be a resident in Allen, Crawford, Defiance, Erie, Fulton, Hancock, Henry, Huron, Lucas, Ottawa, Paulding, Putnam, Richland, Sandusky, Seneca, Van Wert, Williams, Wood or Wyandot Counties
- Children must be entering into the K-8 grade for the 2018-2019 school year

Income and household size must meet requirements (see below) Income Eligibility for the 2018-2019 School Year

Find your income on this chart, and note the percentage of tuition for which you qualify, according to your household size (includes children and adults in house). The maximum scholarship amount is \$1,500. Please remember that each family must pay at least \$500 towards tuition.
