# "Why do Catholics......"

Why don't Catholics believe in contraception? In 1968, Pope Paul VI issued his landmark encyclical letter, Humane Vitae (Human Life), which reemphasized the Church's constant teaching that it is intrinsically wrong to use contraception to prevent a new human being from coming into existence. This includes sterilization, condoms & other barrier methods, spermicides, withdrawal method, the Pill, Abortion, vasectomy, tubal ligation, IUD, etc, with even certain forms of contraception capable of acting as abortifacients. Up until 1930, all Protestant denominations agreed with this teaching condemning contraception as sinful. Then slowly they were swayed by growing social pressure and allowed it. It is condemned in the Bible (such as in Gen.38:8-10) and is so far outside the biblical mindset and so obviously wrong that it did not need the frequent condemnations other sins did. Experience, Natural Law, Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium, all testify to the moral evil of contraception. The so-called "individual conscience" argument is considered "individual disobedience". The marital act is God's gift to married couples and a sign of the unity that God has blessed with an openness to the possibility to a new life. God awaits to extend His forgiveness to those who seek it in these matters.



**THE HECK YOU SAY:** There has been a report that the Pope denied the existence of hell. The report was in a newspaper called *La Republica*, which is owned by an atheist named Eugenio Scalfari. Mr. Scalfari, who is 93 years old, visited the Pope on Easter Sunday since they have been friends for a long time. It was supposed to have been a friendly visit, but Mr. Scalfari wrote it up as a formal interview. Mr. Scalfari never takes notes during an interview or makes a recording; he writes his stories as he remembers them. (Is it wise for a man in his 90s to put this much trust in his memory? I know it's not wise for me at age 70!) He admits that sometimes he leaves out statements made by the person being interviewed; sometimes he adds things that the interviewee might have said if only he were as smart as Mr. Scalfari. Clearly, since Mr. Scalfari owns the newspaper, nobody can tell him what he may or may not print.

What does the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* say about hell? First it says, "We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love Him.... To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice." The Church teaches that hell is eternal separation from God, in whom alone we can possess the life and happiness for which we were created. God does not want anyone to perish in hell; the Church has never definitively taught that any individual is in hell. God wants everyone to come to repentance, but He respects the free will of those who refuse to repent. (See paragraphs 1034-1037 of the *Catechism.*)

There is an obscure theory called "annihilationism", which says that at the Last Judgment, God will annihilate the souls in hell; they will simply cease to exist. The problem with this theory is that God loves everyone and everything that exists. For a soul in hell to stop existing, God would have to cease loving that soul. But God does not change. Such a teaching would also contradict Jesus' teaching in such verses as Mark 9: 42-48, or in Revelation 20: 11-15.
