SUNDAY REFLECTION

Master, I Want To See. “I have never seen it that way,” we might exclaim when a friend opens our eyes. “I did not know him/her that well,” we might murmur when circumstances have shown us some beautiful facets of his/her personality that we had overlooked during years of social contact. Meeting good persons may change our lives. Such persons may open our eyes to values we have overlooked. They may broaden our way of looking at things and encourage us when we are “down in the dumps.” They may show us danger where we do not see it. The miracle narratives of the Gospel tell us about deprived and unhappy people who started a new life once they had met our Lord. Have you “met” our Lord to such an extent that he fascinates you, that you are convinced that doing things his way will brighten your life? Pray that your eyes may be opened to see it! Blindness of mind may deserve blame, if it is caused by indifference and lack of care.

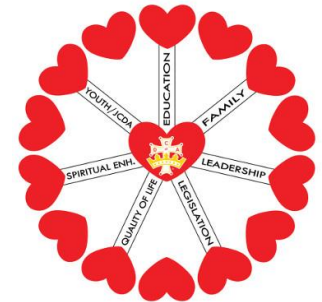

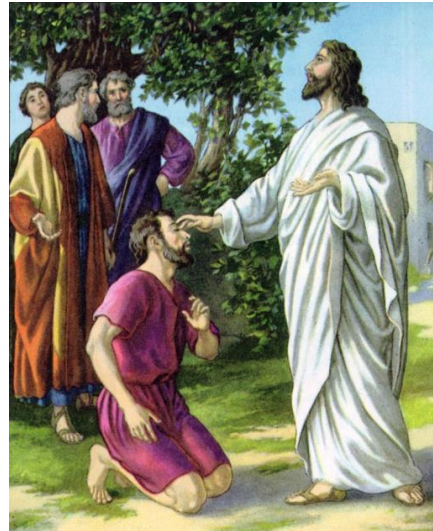
