For many couples, the instant you knew you were pregnant, your life changed forever. Whether you were feeling joy or apprehension, this new baby was an important part of your future. No one could imagine a bad ending to such a beautiful part of growing a family.

One in four pregnancies end in sadness with a miscarriage or stillbirth. The feelings you have after the death of a baby can be overwhelming and intense, as the death of a baby at any stage is a very real loss. You will not only begin a journey of recovering physically, but also emotionally and spiritually. You may feel...

Overwhelming shock, Confusion; Low self-esteem, Loss of control, Disappointment, Jealousy; Anger, Frustration; Guilt and/or self-blame; Sadness and/or depression; Physical symptoms related to hormonal changes

Finding ways to express your grief and finding support can help you feel less "crazy."

When a baby dies, so many expectations and hopes were shattered, and you find yourself trying to put the pieces of life back together when some of them don't fit anymore. The intense feelings of your grief will not last forever. Know that there will come a time when the heartache is less painful.

It is important for you to know that what you are feeling is normal. Give yourself permission to grieve. Intense feelings associated with grief can last up to 2 years, but not all that time is spent in deep grief. Incorporating your loss into daily life for you and family members takes patience and time.

There is no need for your family to grieve alone. If you have lost a baby through miscarriage, stillbirth, abortion, sudden death or a part of a family who has suffered a loss including a lost adoption, join us.

On Sunday, October 15, at 4:00 in the ICS upper parking lot, the Bereavement Ministry in celebration of the life of our babies lost to miscarriage, stillbirth and sudden death will hold a memorial services and Walk to Remember. The service will include a .5 mile walk for those who are able. This service is open to parents, families, grandparents, friends and members of other congregations in our community.

Come share, remember and celebrate the lives of your baby(ies) with us at our annual walk. October is the memorial month for pregnancy loss and observed nationally. Fr. Carl's Little Reservoir...

"My people need me. A shepherd cannot run from his flock." With these words, Fr. Stanley Rother, priest of the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City, who at his own request had been assigned to mission work in Santiago Atilian, Guatemala in 1968, despite the pleas of his family returned to his mission for Easter in 1981 after a brief hiatus from this war torn country from January to March of that year. A few months later, on July 28, 1981, three armed hitmen broke into the rectory to kidnap and kill Fr. Rother. Fr. Rother, age 46, was buried in his hometown of Okarche, Oklahoma, where he had

grown up on the family farm with his older brother and his younger sister, who is now Sister Marita, a member of the Adorers of the Blood of Christ in Witchita, Kansas. But Fr. Rother's heart remained in Guatemala, where he had built schools, hospitals, wells and a Catholic radio station, and will become a relic once he's beatified (final step before canonization) as a martyr on September 23, in Oklahoma City, by Cardinal Amato on behalf of Pope Francis.

Like The Good Shepherd, Blessed Stanley Rother always put the sheep before the shepherd! I humbly bask in the glow of glory of this saintly priest, and pray that I might imitate his example of faithfulness to his flock.



Holyland's Art Will Be Here NEXT Weekend...

With the hostilities worsening in the Holy Land and due to lack of Christian pilgrims, unemployment rate increased to almost 70%.


