

Countdown to Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Beginning Wednesday, February 14 What Do I Do During My Holy Hour?

Now that we have covered what Adoration is and why it benefits us to spend an hour with Jesus each week, let's answer the question, "What in the world do I do during a Holy Hour?"

There are no rules on how one must spend their time during a Holy Hour. There are as many ways to pray and relate to God as there are people He created. A Holy Hour is similar to spending an hour with someone you love. There are endless possibilities as to how to spend an hour with a friend or spouse. Some people like to talk the whole time, some like to just sit and be in the presence of the other, some just let the other talk and listen the whole time. What you do is not as important as just being together. It is the same with God. Some people will prefer to pray devotional prayers such as the rosary. Some may feel called to meditate with scripture. Some may spend their time in intercessory prayer. Some may journal a conversation between them and God. Some may simply sit in silence and let the power of God wash over them. Let the Holy Spirit lead you.

You may feel you do not pray well. Don't let this discourage you. The fact you came to spend time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament pleases Him very much. It is in itself a prayer of faith, which God will abundantly bless.

Our Special Guest: Fr. Victor Warkulwiz, M.S.S., from the Missionary Priests of the Blessed Sacrament, will be our guest homilist at all the Masses the weekend of January 20 and 21. He will preach on the benefits and necessity of Perpetual Adoration in our parish. Fr. Warkulwiz resides in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. He has taken his message of Perpetual Adoration to several hundred parishes in 48 states, Canada, and elsewhere. Fr. Victor has dedicated himself to visiting a parish every weekend where the desire to establish or maintain Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration has been expressed. The fruits of his labor have been bountiful and include a spiritual renewal within each parish.

Please remember that Perpetual Adoration in a parish is not just for a day, a week, a month, or year. It is for always. It is not temporary, but ongoing, lasting, permanent.
