



Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God: Monday, January 1 is the day when the Church celebrates the octave day of Christmas and the divine and virginal motherhood of the Blessed Virgin Mary. An update on Music at Annunciation from Nick Chalmers, Director of Music & Liturgy: Greetings, all. I want to start off by saying how great it has been getting a chance to meet so many of you in the last few months. I really appreciate how welcoming this

community is, and I look forward to forging more relationships with you all in the coming

It has now been a couple of months since the enactment of the new Mass schedule, and I would like to provide some clarity to the current and future music paradigms at Annunciation Church.

The Saturday 5:00pm Vigil Mass will function musically much the same way as it has. A pool of three to four singers will rotate serving as cantor, and the hymns and Mass parts will come largely from the Gather Hymnal and will be accompanied on either the piano or organ. So far this year, we've already had two guest choirs sing for this liturgy, and I hope to incorporate that in the future as well.

The Sunday evening 5:30pm Mass will also continue to function much as it has. It will typically be led by Associate Director of Music Alex Schindler-singing and playing guitar—and will include hymnody from the Gather hymnal, as well as solo music sung by the cantor. While we hope to introduce increasing levels of congregational singing into this liturgy, it is true that this Mass will continue to be the most musically pared down and simple of the weekend liturgies.

With the merging of the 8:45am and 10:30am Masses we now have one combined choir singing for the 9:30am Sunday Mass. This is an inclusive, non-auditioned ensemble comprised of singers from both the previous 8:45am choir and 10:30am ensemble. The choir rehearses weekly on Wednesday's from 7:00pm to 8:30pm and Sunday mornings before Mass and will provide music not only for weekly 9:30am Mass, but also for major Feasts and Solemnities throughout the Liturgical calendar. The primary musical focus of the group will be hymns, antiphons, and Mass parts from the church hymnal, as well as one to two solo anthems per week. The choir is open to any interested parties age 18+ of ANY experience level. While we have increased in number in the past weeks, we are still very much looking for more singers. Please join us!

Because the new 9:30am Choir differs somewhat stylistically from what was previously the 10:30am Ensemble, the 10:30am Ensemble has been asked to provide music for certain solemnities and feasts throughout the Liturgical year as well.

Music is a vehicle of sacramental beauty intended to elevate the faithful to be closer to God. I thank each of you for your continued support of that very ministry.

We want to thank you for your prayers and concern for our daughter-in-law, Jocelyn. She was hit by a car in July and suffered a traumatic brain injury. When people asked what they could do we said, pray, pray as hard as you can. And you did. And her healing journey began. She is now five months into what doctors estimate will be a year or more recovery process. She is doing remarkably well, everyday able to do more and more. We are so grateful for the prayers and support we have received and continue to receive from our Annunciation community. Many, many thanks. In the coming months we hope to open a Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration chapel here at Annunciation. In preparation, there will be a weekly series to help our parish community engage in this process.

Countdown to Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Beginning Wednesday, February 14, 2018 Reflection Focus: What Is Eucharistic Adoration?

Last week we went over a basic understanding of how the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our Catholic faith. This week we are going to move into the topic of what exactly Eucharistic Adoration is.

Adoration is one of several types of prayer outlined within the third section (Life In Christ) of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and is defined as "the first attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator." Last week we stated that the Eucharist is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, so whenever we gaze upon a consecrated host, we are looking at Jesus Christ himself fully present before us.

During Eucharistic Adoration a priest (or another minister) typically exposes the Blessed Sacrament, which has been placed in a special glass case called a *luna* from the tabernacle, and places it within a golden stand called a *Monstrance*. The word monstrance is derived from the Latin word *monstrare* which means to show. So when the luna that contains the host is placed in the monstrance it is showing us Jesus Christ present under the appearance of the simple bread. This Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is an extension of the adoration which takes place within each Mass as the priest says, "Behold the Lamb of God,...Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb," and serves to deepen our hunger for communion with Christ and His Church.

Let us pray that we truly come face to face with our Eucharistic Lord Jesus Christ when we gaze upon the host held within a monstrance and grow ever deeper in our hunger for communion with Him.

Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament, please grant Annunciation Church the grace of perpetual adoration.
