"The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." Those gathered in the synagogue where Jesus taught had never heard anything like this before. They were used to the preaching of the well-educated scribes, but Jesus possessed something that those men lacked: authority. Instead of merely interpreting the laws of the prophets, Jesus presented a new vision, indeed, he shared the good news of the Gospel with his listeners.

We do not have the opportunity to stand in the presence of Jesus in the same way that those first-century Jews did, but nonetheless we can also stand in awe of his authority. His teachings are available to us through the sacred Scriptures that the Church has preserved and through the sacred tradition that the Church carries on. And in a special way, Christ's authority continues to inspire and guide us through the ministries of the papacy, episcopacy, and priesthood that Jesus established on our behalf while he was yet on earth.

As Catholics, we have a special share in the astonishing authority of Jesus through the hierarchy of the Church. Although this structure is often misunderstood or misinterpreted, it is actually an authority rooted in service and modeled after Christ who told his apostles, "The greatest among you must be your servant" (Mt 23:11).

This humble exercise of authority is contrary to the worldly search for power. And whenever we find ourselves in a position of authority, we too should strive to lead and direct others in the true spirit of Christian love and service. Chances are, if we truly imitate Christ in this way, people will be astonished at what they see.

the Eagles. It was all about keeping the miracle alive and making history by being the first team to play a Super bowl in their own home stadium. It was so infectious that Father Jim started the Skol chant at the end of Mass Sunday morning and I led it in the Gathering Area at Corpus Christi. As I parked the car at Corpus for the 6pm Mass, the Vikings were ahead 7-0, had stopped the Eagles on a three and out, and had the ball back. All was well. In fact, the interest was so great that, including me, the scheduled lector, Mass Coordinator, and musicians, there were at total of 59 people at the 6pm Mass! By the end of Mass the story had changed. The Eagles were ahead 24-7, and it only got worse from there. The euphoria of the dream season ending in a hometown Super Bowl was fun while it lasted. It gave us an escape which matched the bright sunny days and helped us forget that it was so bitter cold. That made the final result of last Sunday's game so crushing that it pushed the things of real importance off the front page things like the winter storm which could be life-threatening in many ways and especially to the homeless, and the fact that the government had shut down due to the lack of a budget which was supposed to be in place last October.

Happily, our lives are not defined by one sports team, by their success or lack thereof. So now it is back to the moments of each day, to the regular little joys and successes and all the everyday things we need to accomplish. And, by the way, even though the Vikings are not in it, the Super Bowl is still coming to town. Something tells me, however, that because the Vikings are not in it, there may be at least a few more people at the 6pm Mass at Corpus Christi next weekend, although one of them will not be me.

Last January, 2017, was typically busy with the wrap-up of the Christmas season, the Epiphany Pageant at Corpus Christi and the School Epiphany Mass, First Reconciliation on consecutive Saturdays at each parish, and the Catholic Schools Week Sunday Mass. My extended Brady family decided to take a week together in the warm Caribbean

weather of Cozumel but I could not be gone either weekend. In order to get any winter break at all, I flew down on Monday and came back on Friday, giving me three full and two half days of a delightful, necessary, and appreciated break. This year the whole family is not planning to repeat, but a few of us made plans for the Super Bowl - to be out of town! We are leaving Monday morning and flying to Fort Lauderdale to board the Royal Princess for a 10 day Caribbean Cruise. So as the first of the one million visitors are arriving for the Super Bowl festivities we will be leaving, and as they are leaving on Thursday, February 9, we will be arriving home. (And none of us are renting out our homes. We want to find them here and good shape when we return.) While I am away, as usual, my emergency phone which serves both parishes will go directly to Marie Winn, our Pastoral Associate. She will forward any necessary information to Father Jim, Amy our Pastoral Minister, or Toni, the Pastoral Minister at Corpus Christi. Next weekend Father Jim will have the Masses at Corpus Christi, and Father Tom Hunstiger will be at Saint Rose to bring you up to date with one of our familiar outreach ministries. Cross Catholic Outreach. At some point on Saturday or Sunday I will celebrate Mass with at least our little group, or perhaps with anyone else on the ship if I am given permission to do so. I have done this many times in the past and it is always a great way to meet new people. On Sunday evening, we will be watching the Super Bowl as we sail from Bonaire to Aruba.

Finally, one of the concerns of hosting the Super Bowl is the effect is has on some of the important ministries that serve the homeless and hungry. We will participate in that effort with the annual Souper Sunday collection of groceries and donations. Our Confirmation Candidates will be at the doors after Mass with soup kettles. Please be generous.



Hearing devices with a receiver, earpiece and freshly charged battery are available at the church side entrances. They pick up a signal directly from the church sound system. The ear piece sits gently over (not in) the ear. You control the volume.

Please clean the earpiece and place the unit back in the charger after Mass.




