ST MATTHEW FINANCIAL UPDATE

FOR YEAR 2016-17 (ENDING JUNE 30, 2017)

The financial books are closed for the past year and the parish ended the year approximately \$20,000 in the "red" (expenses exceeding revenue). The mortgage was "paid off" but the parish had to deal with the aging facilities in terms of HVAC replacement, parking/sidewalk repair, rectory maintenance and an unexpected property tax bill on the farm land south of the facilities. The good news was the child care/preschool and extended care functions had profitable years to help offset the expenses of the school that exceed revenue generated. The Finance Council is watching expenses closely but the parish clearly needs more revenue. How can you help? We need to increase the weekly collections from Sunday Mass. If everyone increased their weekly contribution by the cost of a Big Mac, it would do much to alleviate the revenue shortcoming. Also, promoting our outstanding school to your friends and neighbors would help out. The school has tremendous room for growth at relatively no increase in expense. Each new student means pure profit to the parish. Thank you.

There might even be a revenue generating opportunity to sell advertising (like back of this bulletin); offer space to the City of Bellevue to communicate the long awaited 36th Street upgrade dates/plans, or allow parishioners to announce a son/daughter’s birthday as they arrive for school or CCD or recognize wedding anniversaries. The opportunities are endless. If 100 parishioners donated \$100 each, we would reach our goal in the next month and see a marquee by early fall. The marquee is the next step in the Pathway to Our New Church. Let’s keep the “buzz” going. Thank you.

of parishioner contributions to reach the \$40,000 needed for this project!

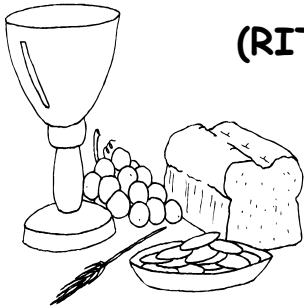
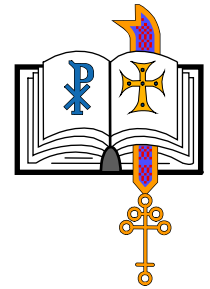
