FAST AND ABSTINENCE LAWS

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season, which lasts until Holy Thursday, the Mass of the Last Supper when we enter the Holy Triduum. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are permitted to consume only one full meal, which may be supplemented by two smaller meals, which together should not equal the full meal. Many Catholics will go beyond the minimum obligations demanded by the Church and undertake a complete fast or a bread and water fast. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of abstinence from meat, as are all Fridays in Lent. Many Catholics continue fasting during the whole of Lent, as was the Church's traditional requirement, concluding only after the celebration of the Easter Vigil.

A GLANCE AT PARISH FINANCES.

(Look for this heading in future bulletins to stay abreast of the St Matthew financial status.)

This is the first year St Matthew has had a monthly budget to compare to actual revenues and expenses each month. This allows monitoring financial progress more closely. The Parish has a long history of “deferred maintenance” because the Sunday collections never provided enough funds to do preventative maintenance. And many of our buildings are over 50 years old. Normally we wait until something breaks and then panic to find funds to do band aid fixes. Because this is no way to run an operation, the Finance Council raised the 2017-18 fiscal budget for maintenance from \$25,000 to \$40,500 in hopes of addressing the issue. Unfortunately, half way through the year (Dec 2017), we have spent \$39,255 of the \$40,500 budget. As a parishioner of St Matthew, would you prayerfully consider contributing \$2 - \$5 more each week, so the Parish can start to address these very real maintenance needs? Thank you.

SHROVE TUESDAY



Shrove Tuesday, the day before the beginning of Lent, New Orleans becomes a community devoted exclusively to revelry, noise, and general madness. This is Mardi Gras time, and

the city surrenders itself to torchlight parades, fantastic floats, brass bands, and pageantry. Decorations everywhere are in the carnival official colors of purple, gold, and blue.

The last day of the Carnival season is Mardi Gras. The word "Carnival" is in fact derived from Latin carne vale: "farewell, meat". The church bells ring out early in the morning on Ash Wednesday.

In England the day is called "Pancake Day". The people compete to see who can bake the largest pancake, throw it up into the air and catch it on its way down on the griddle in a flapping motion. We call the "flapjacks" in this country.

ASH WEDNESDAY

In the Western Christian calendar, Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. It occurs forty-six days before Easter, but Lent is nevertheless considered forty days long, because Sundays in this period are not counted as days of penance. It falls on different dates from year to year, according to the date of Easter; it can occur as early as February 4 or as late as March 10.

At Masses on this day, worshippers are blessed with ashes by the celebrating priest. The priest marks the forehead of each participant with black ashes, in the shape of a cross, which the worshipper traditionally retains until washing it off after sundown. The person who distributes ashes may be a layperson. Symbolism echoes the ancient Near Eastern tradition of throwing ash over one's head signifying repentance before God (as related in the Bible). The priest offers the person receiving ashes an instruction while applying the ashes. These are three examples:

"Remember, man, that you are dust
And unto dust you shall return."

This wording comes from Genesis 3:19.

or "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."
or "Repent, and hear the good news."

The ashes are prepared by burning palm leaves from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebrations and mixing them with olive oil as a fixative. In the Roman Catholic Church, Ash Wednesday is observed by fasting, abstinence (from meat), and repentance—a day of contemplating one's transgressions. The ashes are sacramentals, not a sacrament. The penitential psalms are read.
