CHURCH BUILDING UPDATE

We are "moving dirt." After some delay in securing a grading permit, we finally have some movement on the site. Grading will take two to three weeks. Fortunately, we will not need to bring in nor take out any extra dirt, so dump truck traffic on and off the property should be minimal. After the site is leveled out, we will pour the foundations.

We are close to signing contracts with Wood Specialists for Sanctuary Furniture, Lambrecht Glass Studio for stained glass and Gunder Furniture for pews. We are under contract with Michael Montag for the Sanctuary crucifix. Once we have pricing for these items, we will publish a list of items that parishioners can consider donating. While we currently have sufficient funding to purchase all of these items, if you would like to help offset the overall cost of the new church the purchase of altar candles or a station of the cross, for example, would help out. More to follow on that.

Still on track to celebrate Christmas Mass 2019 in our new church.

- **6.** Concrete pad for dumpsters \$5K A concrete pad is needed to prevent any further damage to our asphalt caused by the heavy garbage trucks that service us.
- 7. <u>Classroom Lighting update for efficiency est. \$24K</u>) *Partially Funded* ~2 *classrooms completed* Upgrading the classroom lighting would enhance the learning experience and reduce utility bill.
- **8.** <u>Materials for maintaining playground \$3K</u>. Minutemen are working on this project.
