PARISH STORAGE PROGRAM

A message from our Parish Storage Authority: The members of our parish here at Saint Matthew's have always been very generous. Many have donated valuable items for use by our parish and school. However, we developed have а problem.

Our parish campus has very limited storage capability available to keep donated items. In order to ensure we are keeping what is needed for future use and to eliminate those items we no longer have a need for, we have developed a Storage Program.

Any person or organization desiring to provide, donate or appropriate items for our parish that require storage for some future use by the parish or school will require approval from the Parish Storage Authority prior to delivery of any items to the parish complex.

This requirement is <u>not applicable</u> to those donating to the Silent Auction Program, the Craft Fair, the Knight's of Columbus Medical Equipment, Loan Pantry or the Annual Parish Garage Sale. The organizers of these programs will be responsible for the acceptance, safe storage and distribution of any such donated items. The organizers of these activities shall insure that items are safely stored, that coordination with the Facility Lead for temporary storage of any items is accomplished and that any residue of donated items is eliminated from temporary storage as soon as possible after the activity has concluded.

More specific information including request forms may be obtained from the Parish Administrative Office. Requests for approval will be received by the Parish Administration Office who will forward them to the approving authority for consideration.


SCRIPTURE STUDY WITH DEACON DEALL
